#### **Disabled Vets** May Take Farm G. I. Training

Able-bodied veterans have no monopoly on institutional onfarm training.

A World War II veteran with a service-connected ailment can take this training, too, according to the Veterans Administration, if VA considers the training necessary for him to overcome his handicap. In fact, he may get training for as long as is necessary to restore his ability to work, up to a total of four years.

Unlike able-bodied veterans who apply at the school in their community approved for on-farm training, disabled veterans should apply for this training at their nearest VA office. They should take along a certified or photostatic copy of their discharge papers. If they are married or have dependents, they should bring marriage certificate and other documents that will establish their dependency claims.

Before they begin institutional on-farm training, disabled veterans are interviewed by VA counselors who help them decide on the type of training they should

#### **BURNING PERMITS**

Burning pesmits are required for brush or woodland burning during the forest fire season months of February, March and April. These permits may be obtained from Hoke County Warden, C. F. McBryde, any Hoke County Fire Tower, District Fire Warden or other authorized representative.

These permits cost nothing and the law is designed to protect your woodlots from indescrimniate burning.

Obtaining a permit does not relieve the premittee of responsibility if the fire gets out of control. To be safe, observe the following rules:

1. Obtain a permit and notify your neighbors of your intention to burn.

2. Plow a good fire line around the area to be burned.

3. Burn only after a good rain when the woods are damp and fire will not spread. 4. Burn in the evening and on

days when there is no wind and the humidity is high. 5. Keep fire fighting tools and a supply of water on hand while

burning. 6. Keep your brush piles small. 7. Patrol the area after

burning is completed.
