Have You Filed Your Individual Income Tax Return

Person required to file - amount of income. Every single person, or married person not living with husband or wife, receiving income in excess of the \$1,000.00 personal exemption, plus allowable deductions, during the year 1948.

Every married woman receiving income in excess of the \$1,000.00 personal exemption, plus allowable deductions, during the year 1948.

Every married man living with his wife on December 31, 1948, receiving income in excess of the \$2,000.00 personal exemption, plus allowable deductions.

Every person engaged in merchandising, farming, contracting, or in any kind of business or profession who received income as indicated above during the year 1948.

Every employer who paid a single person or married woman \$1,000.00 or more during the year 1948, or a married man living with his wife on December 31, 1948, \$2,000.00 or more during the year, is required to report to the North Carolina Department of Revenue the amount paid to each employee giving the name and address of the employee. These reports are required to be filed on or before March 15, 1949.

Failure to file income tax returns on or before March 15, 1949 may result in an assessment of a penalty of 5 to 25 per cent.

Representatives of the State Department of Revenue will be available throughout the State from February 1 to March 15, 1949, inclusive, for the purpose of assisting persons in preparing their returns for the year 1948. There is, of course, no charge for these services.

Notices will be posted in the courthouses, post offices and other public places indicating where and when these representatives may be contacted. Returns may be filed with local representatives of the State Department of Revenue, or they may be mailed direct to the North Carolina Department of Revenue, Raleigh, North Carolina. All taxes should be paid by check or money order rather than cash, unless it is paid to a representative of the Department and receipt is given for same.

A representative of Department of Revenue will be in Raeford March 3 at the courthouse from 10:30 to 3:00 to assist with making returns.
