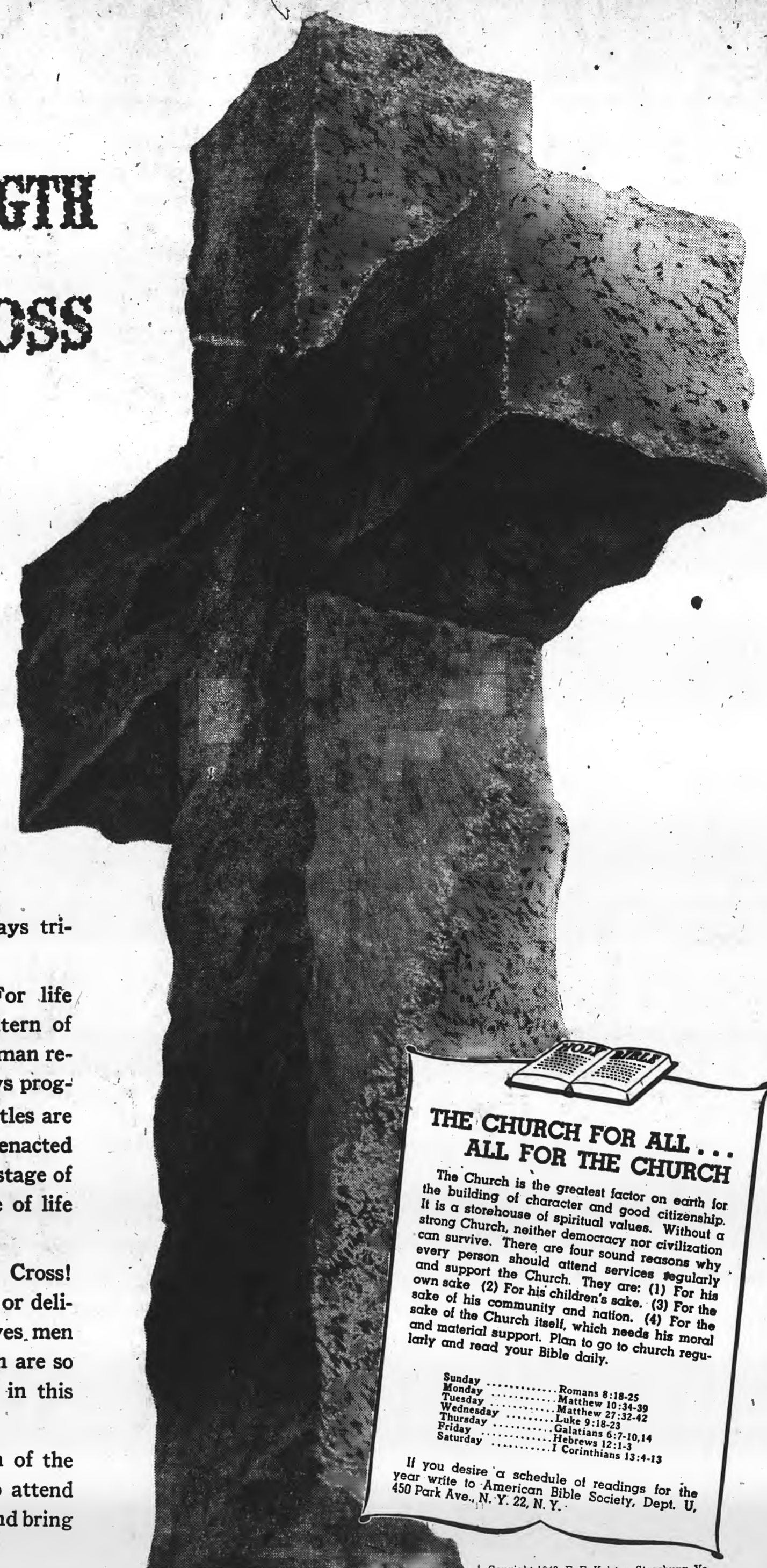
THE STRENGTH OF THE CROSS
