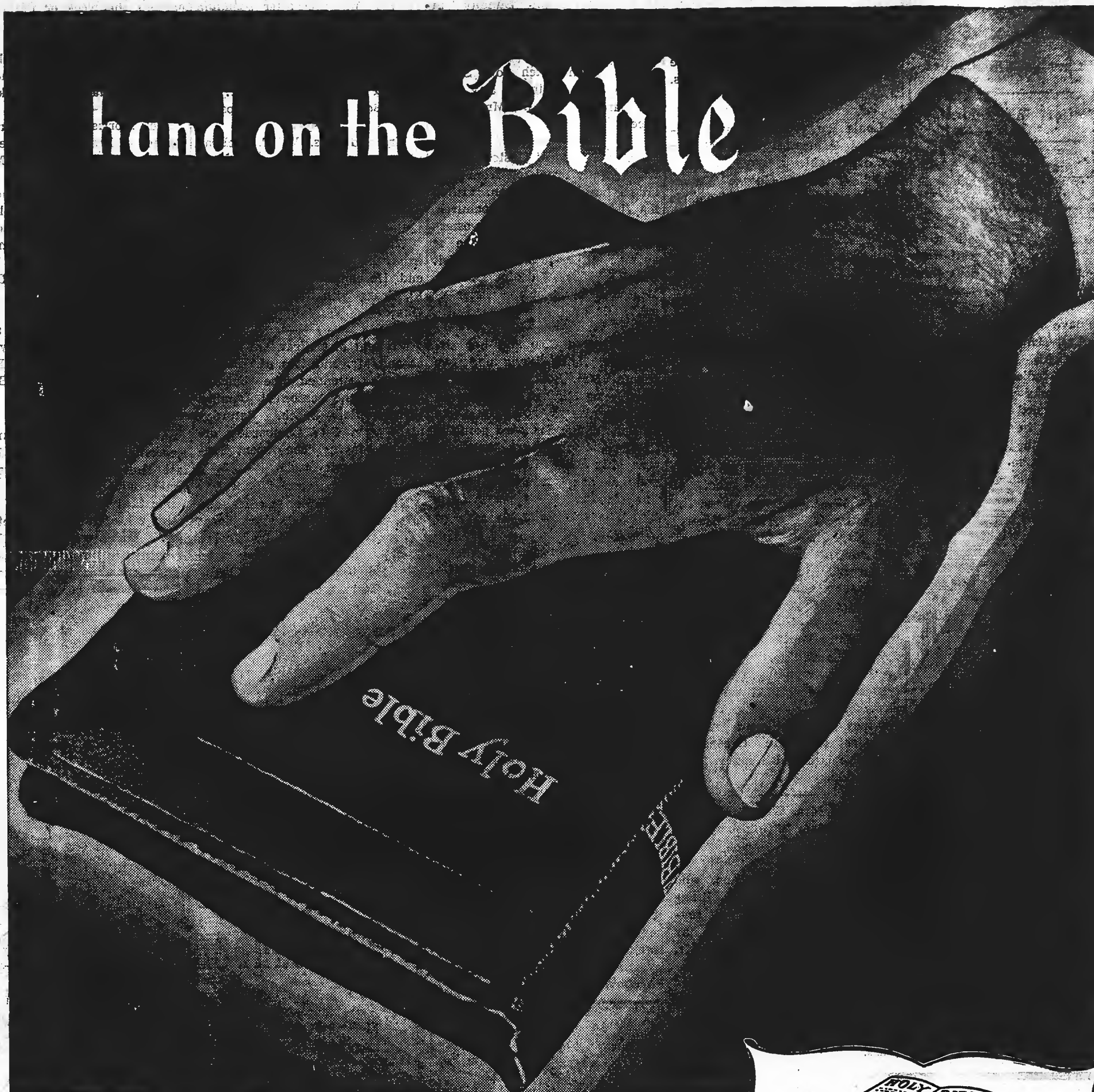


# Hand on the Bible
