July shoppers will find a wide selection of foods on the U. S. Department of Agriculture's plentiful foods list for Southern markets, says Miss Josephine Hall, home demonstration agent for the State College Extension Service.

Producers are culling inefficient hens from laying flocks and sending heavy birds to market, in addition to already plentiful supplies of broilers and fryers. The 1949 production of broilers and fryers is the greatest in history.

Cheese and fish landings are usually heavy in July, and markets should offer buyers a choice of either fresh or frozen fish. Cottage cheese is a newcomer.

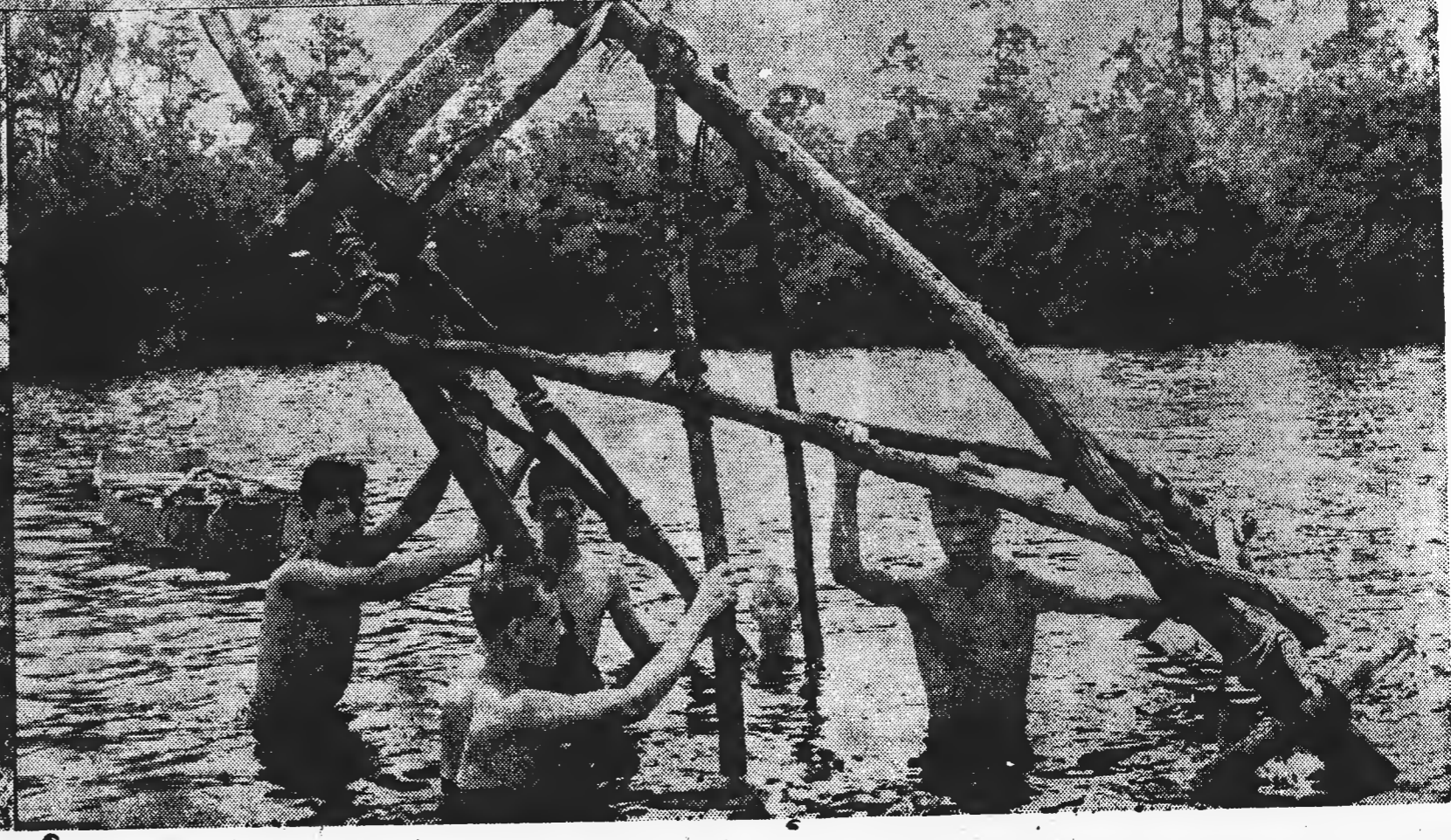
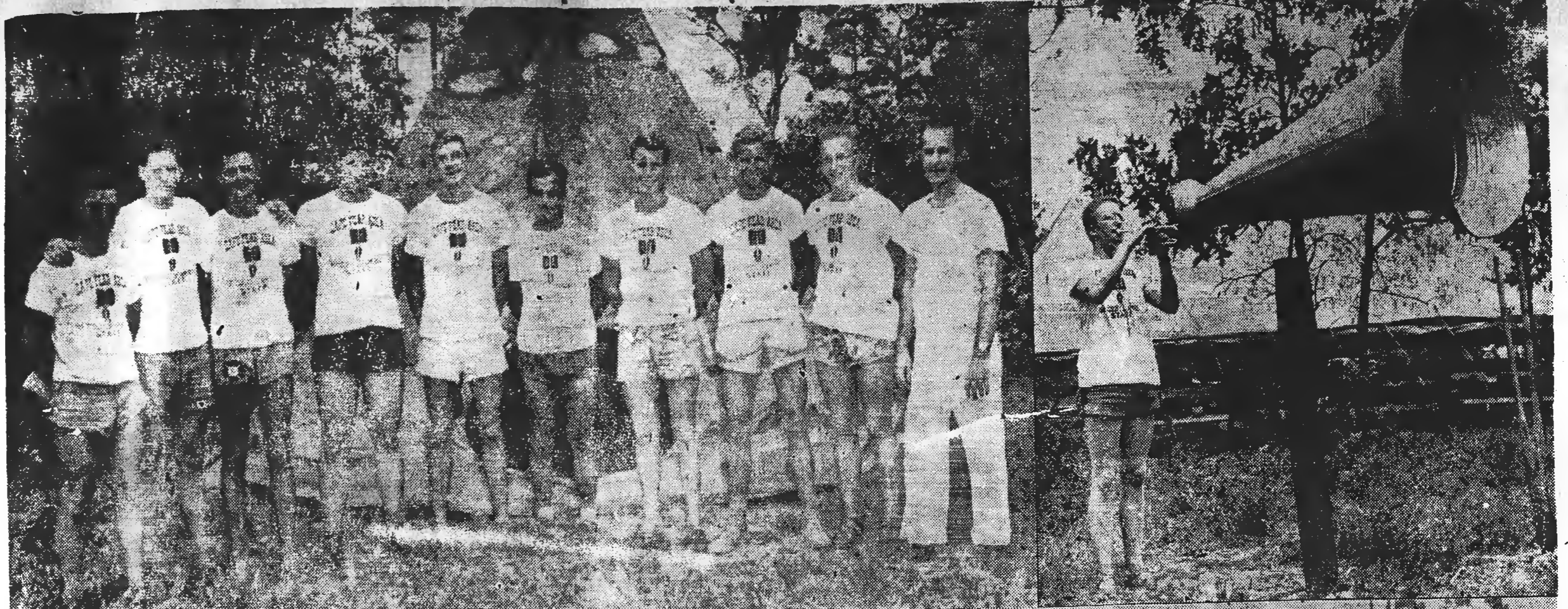

to the plentiful list, the home agent said. The fat content of cottage cheese is low, which makes it low in calories in relation to other nutrients and, therefore, well suited for people looking for a nourishing food that is not fattening.

Dried beans and peas, peanut butter, and eggs also are reported plentiful, while the vegetable trio for the month will be cabbage, canned corn, and Irish potatoes. More sweet corn was packed in 1948 than in any previous year.

Markets already had a near-record carryover from the previous season and, as a result, retail supplies are considerably larger than usual.

Good quality honey supplies are plentiful, Miss Hall said, though the best buys are in the large containers—5 to 60 pound cans.

Canned peaches, apricots, and mixed fruits, especially fruit cocktail, are on the July list, along with fresh plums. California's plum crop, this year probably will be the second largest in history, and shipment should reach some Southern markets.

MORE ABOUT Lay Days

The results determined and declared by the Executive Director of the Wildlife Resources Commission and any voting licensee or licensees, whether one or more, of such county, desiring to assist in such determination, on a date to be announced by publication of a notice in some newspaper published in such county or by posting a copy of such notice at the Courthouse door of any county in which a newspaper is published. Such notice shall give the date and hour at which the tabulation of votes and determination of the result of such referendum shall commence in the offices of the N. C. Wildlife Resources Commission at Raleigh, N. C. If no voting licensee shall appear to assist in the tabulation and determination of the result of such referendum, the tabulation and determination by the Executive Director shall be deemed sufficient and final.

Holders of hunting licenses for the 1948-49 season who are residents of any such county, but who did not purchase such hunting licenses within such county, will be sent a business reply postal card as above provided for, upon notice in sufficient time to the Director by such license holder, giving the name of the county in which his license was purchased and the approximate date of such purchase.

Lay days shall be established on all species of game, for the 1949-50 season, in any county wherein it is determined that a majority of such resident holders of 1948-49 hunting licenses entitled to vote as herein provided, have indicated a preference for lay days, and upon such determination and declaration of the results of said referendum in any county so applying, the Executive Director is hereby specifically authorized and empowered to curtail the hunting season in such coun-

ties on all species of game by the establishment of lay days by which hunting shall be permitted only on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays of each week during the open seasons established for each species of game within such county."

Notice of the rules and regulations established by this resolution shall be given by publication of a general news release and by posting a copy hereof in each county of the State in which lay days were established during the 1947-48 hunting season at the Courthouse door of such counties and at the Courthouse door of any county in the State, in the discretion of the Director of the Wildlife Resources Commission."

Springs on the Lumberton Highway.
