### Senators Praise Farm Bureau For Serving Farmers

North Carolina's two United State Senators, Clyde R. Hoey and Frank P. Graham, declared in statements released this week that the North Carolina Farm Bureau is rendering a great service to the farmers of the State. Statements were made in support of the current NCFB state-wide campaign for 80,000 members.

Senator Hoey, who serves on the Senate Committee on Agriculture and Forestry, said that "our whole committee relies very strongly upon the recommendations made by the Farm Bureau." Commending the Farm Bureau for "the farsighted policy it has adopted and for its leadership in championing the cause of the farmers of the Nation," he added, "we find that this Organization gives very earnest and intelligent consideration to farm policies and their recommendations and testimony before our Committee are always most helpful in adopting our agricultural program."

In support of the current membership drive, Senator Graham said, "the North Carolina Farm

Bureau has always stood for the improvement of agriculture, education, health, and the economic, social and spiritual well being of our people."

"In a world in which business and labor are increasingly well organized," Graham said, "it is important for the American people that the farmers be organized for the development of the rural people who are acknowledged to be the backbone of America and a main source from which are renewed the faith and hope of

America." Graham referred to the often quoted recommendation of Dean I. O. Schaub, Director, N. C. State College Experiment Station: "Every farmer should join some strong and well directed farm organization."

"My long association with the leaders and members of the North Carolina Farm Bureau Federation," he added, "leads me to wish the Bureau its most successful membership campaign."

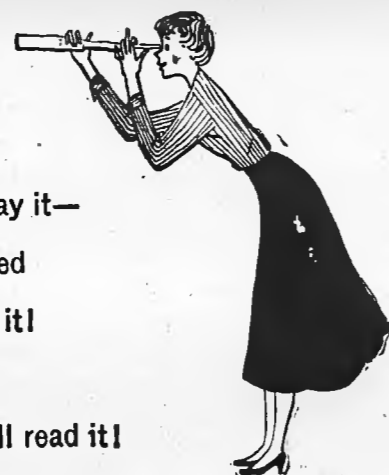
