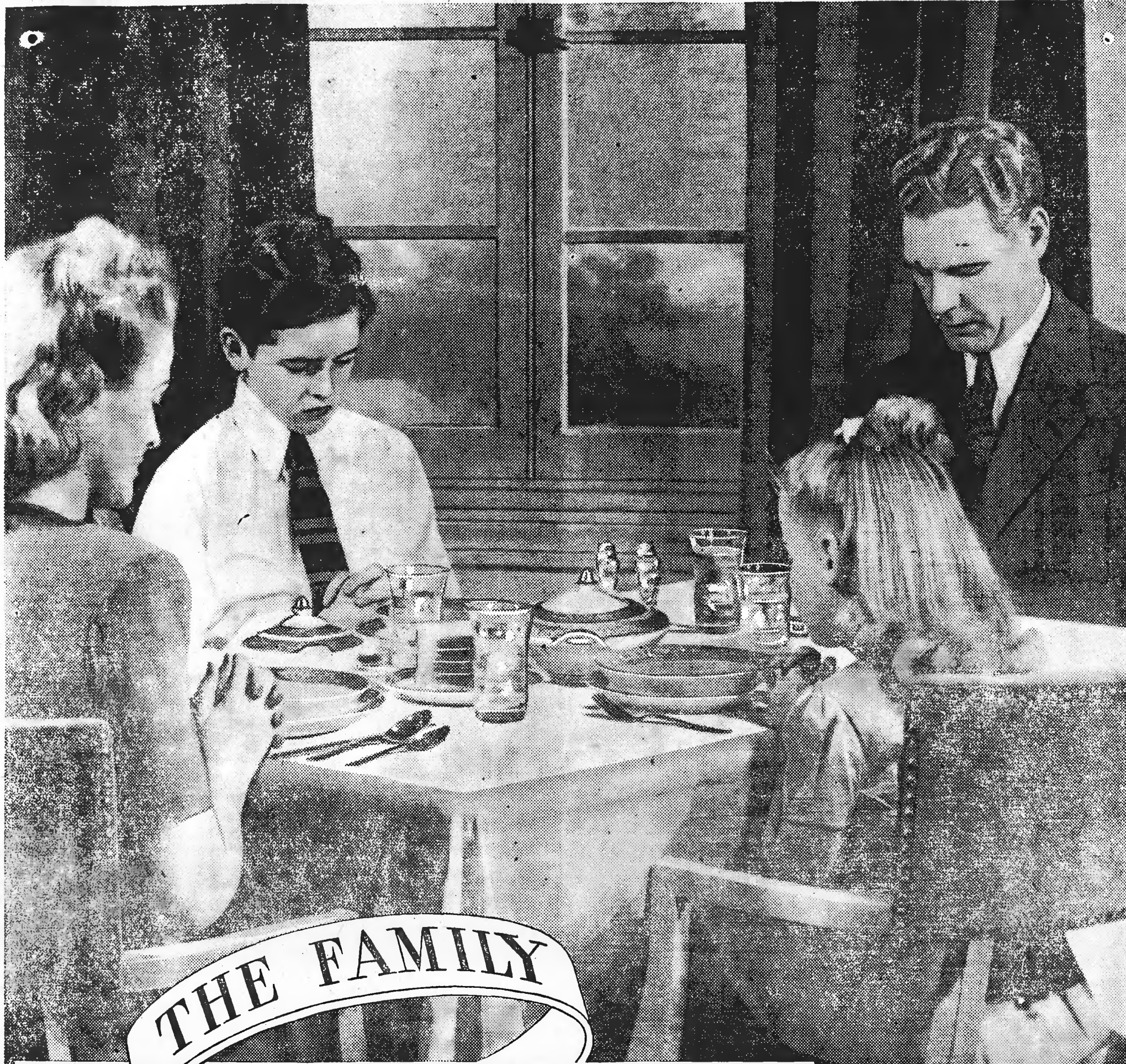

THE FAMILY

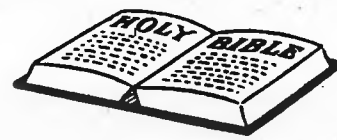
The family is the basic unit of organized society. From it have grown the tribe, the nation, and the race. Its development marked man's first step from primitive to civilized life.
