News that the paving of the Raeford-Vass road across the Fort Bragg reservation to Little River township has become a possibility for the near future is welcome news to the people of hat township in particular, and also to all the people of the county. We are grateful to Congressman Charles B. Deane for his efforts to bring it about.

Since the formation of the Fort Bragg reservation the people of Little River have been orphaned as far as their county seat was concerned, having either to travel a long bad road | mother, Mrs. J. D. Now, if the road is paved, they will be able to carry on their normal business in their county seat as other people do and will begin to feel that they are a part of the county again. As they will become closer by a better road they will more actively participate in affairs which concern the whole county, and we hope that they will come to feel that they are on equal basis with other parts of the county in receiving such improvements and benefits as may be allotted from time to time

This is indeed welcome news to the whole county and it is the general hope that the paving may become an early reality.


