soil where they will do the most good. The soil should then be smoothed with a tandem or horse drawn disk followed by a drag narrow. As soon as possible after the seed has been settled by a rain the fertilizer should be applied and soil freshened with a drag harrow and seeded. Use 2-12-12 fertilizer at the rate of 1000 lbs. per acre. This can best be applied with a grain drill which will give even distribution and place the fertilizer in the ground instead of on top.

Seeding should be done uniformly and covered lightly - not over 1/2 inch. The best method of seeding is with seeding attachment on a cultipacker. This sows and covers the seed in one operation. A Cyclone hand seeder can be used or a grain drill with the pressure spring released. Cross seeding is advisable when using any method other than the cultipacker. After seeding it is important that the soil be firmed with some type of roller to aid germination and protect the inoculum.

Two lbs. of ladino clover and 12 lbs. of Fescue is ample seed per acre if a shallow, firm and well pulverized seed bed is prepared.

It is absolutely necessary that the clover seed be inoculated and it is advisable to use twice the amount recommended on the container. This inoculation is good until a date which is stamped on the container. Be sure that date

has not passed and that the inoculum used is for Ladino-Clover. This also will be printed on the container.

The best method of inoculation is to place the seed in an open container such as a tub or pan. Add a small amount of sugar or syrup to a bucket of water. Pour enough of this water on the seed to moisten them. Stir seed to be sure each seed is moistened. Then add the inoculum and mix thoroughly so that each seed is coated with it. If needed add enough cottonseed meal or dry soil to dry the seeds and make sowing easier.

Sunshine kills inoculum so this preparation of seed should be done in the shade and the seed immediately sowed and covered. The use of sugar or syrup in the water is important because its stickiness holds the inoculum to the seed and also it provides food for the bacteria until the seed germinates.

It is best to sow the seed on a cloudy day. If this is not possible then they should be sown late in the afternoon.

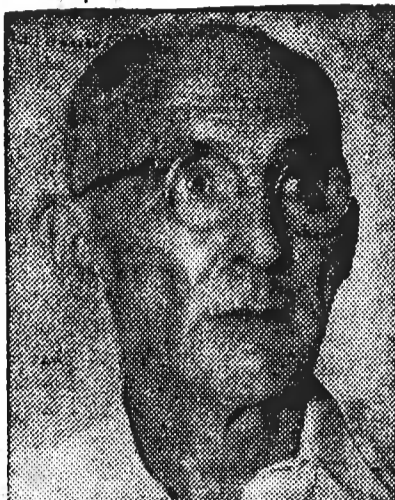

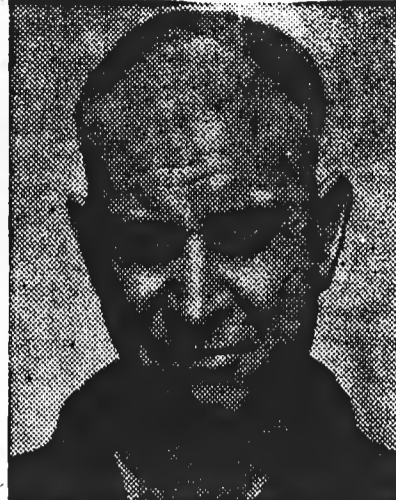
