### Profits In A Good Year

A great many people apparently still believe that profits and dividends to stockholders are among the biggest items in the ledger sheets of industry. But the fact is that they are among the smallest.

As an example, take the 1949 financial experience of a corporation which is one of the largest and most successful in the world, and which produces automobiles and trucks, household appliances and other goods. This company is not chosen because it had a poor profit record-indeed, in that respect it did far better than the average corporation.

First, more than 50 cents went to suppliers, for materials and services needed to carry on the company's production program.

Second, a trifle more than 26 cents went to employees. Third, 10-cents-plus went to government for taxes.

Fourth, a little less than two cents was set aside to provide for depreciation and obsolescence of plants and equipmentmachines wear out and must be replaced.

company-434,000 stockholders.

Finally, the remainder, about five cents, was retained for use in the business.

In 1949, this corporation's dividends on each share of common stock were almost twice as great as in 1948. Yet, even tively, and the cost relatively so, the owners received only about a fourth as much as the small. He sold the crop for \$2.50 workers-and not much more than half as much as government. Profit is a relatively small item in the cost of carrying on American business.

## What Is Your Answer?
