Misses Belle Smith and Libby Suddreth, who attend Appalachian State Teachers College in Boone this year, have returned home for the summer months.

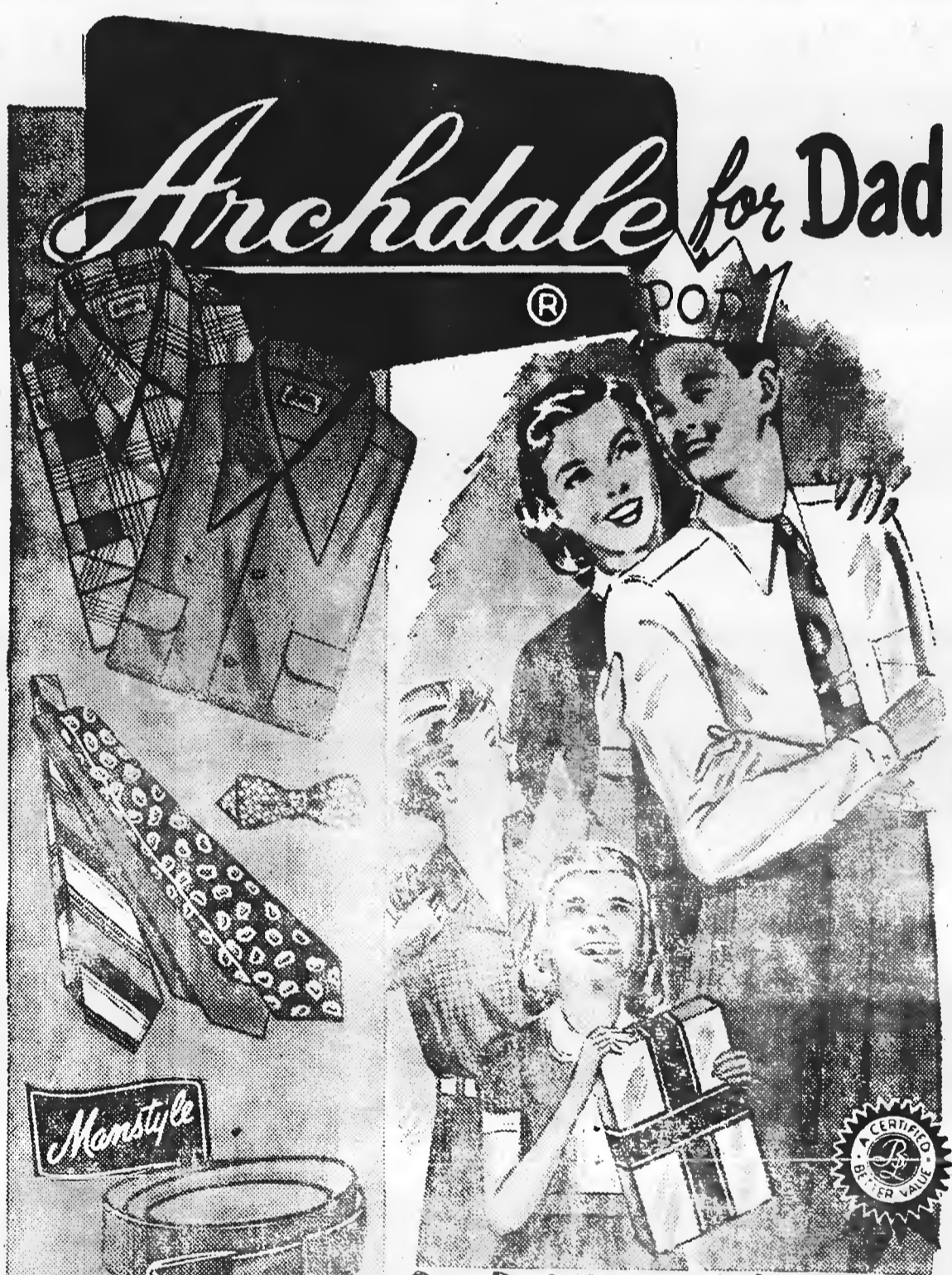
