Mrs. John Baker of the Little River club gave a demonstration on making flowers and corsages from old nylon hose, and the Home Agent discussed making corsages from other flowers and made several corsages in the demonstration. The essentials for making corin at least two guages-fine and coarse, flowers, foliage, and ribbon.
