HINTS TO FARM HOMEMAKERS

STATE COLLEGE HINTS — WATER MARK DAMAGE — Marks or rings from wet glasses, vases or plants are common on tables, especially if these surfaces have not been waxed. Wax cannot prevent damage caused by allowing liquids to stand on the finish indefinitely. However, it will keep them from being absorbed immediately, thus giving you time to wipe up the liquid before it can damage the finish. If water marks appear, here are some suggestions you might try. Place a clean, thick blotter over the ring and press with a warm (not hot) iron. Repeat until rings disappear. Apply liquid wax with 4/0 steel wool.

or rub marks with rottenstone and oil, or try camphorated oil.
