This Is The Law

May rabbits be box-trapped or hunted without a gun at any time?

Yes. But they cannot be killed with a gun other than between November 24 and January 31. An exception has been made in Duplin County, where they can be killed with a gun up until February 15.

How many rabbits may a person lawfully kill during a day?

Five. He cannot legally kill more than seventy-five during the season.

May rabbits be purchased for the purpose of resale?

No. It is unlawful at any time to buy rabbits for the purpose of resale.

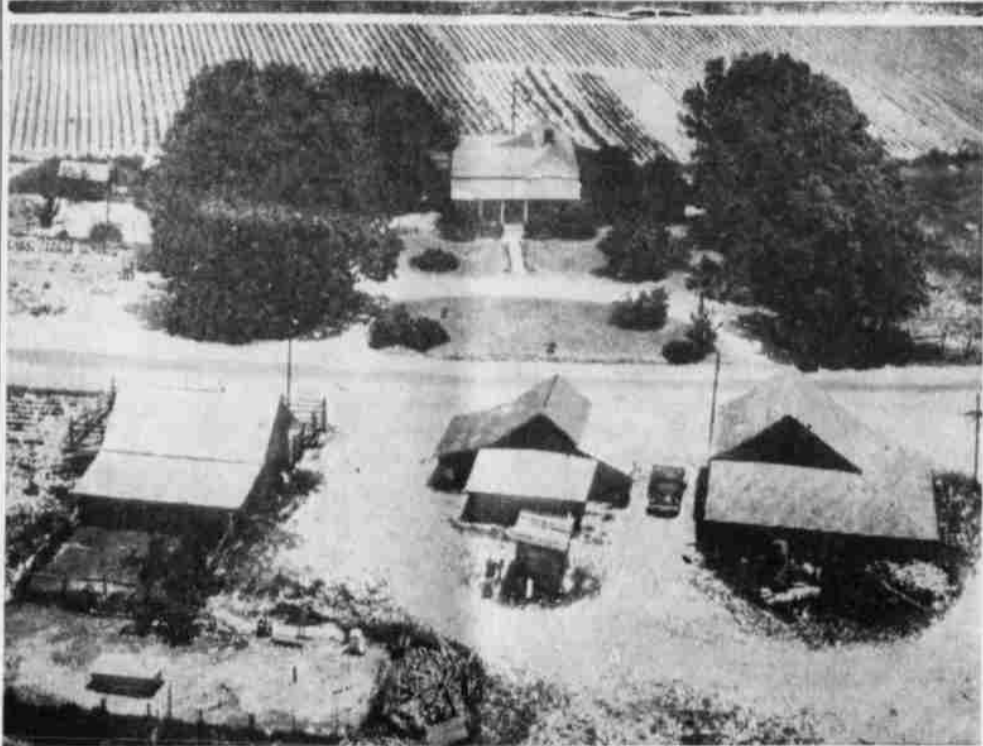
Is it lawful to set a steel trap for a bear?

No.

May a deer be lawfully taken or killed while swimming or in water up to its knees?

No.

CAN YOU IDENTIFY THIS Hoke County Farm?

Is it lawful to hunt and kill game birds and game animals from automobiles?

No.

"Game birds" are quail (com-

only called bobwhite or partridge), wild turkey, grouse, and pheasant.

"Game animals" are deer, bear, fox, squirrel, rabbit, and wild boar.

May game birds or game ani-

mals be lawfully hunted by the use of a jacklight or other artificial light?

No. However, it is not unlawful to use an artificial light when hunting racoons or opossum with dogs, or when hunting frogs.

Is it lawful to hunt and kill a

game bird on a field where corn, wheat or other grain has been deposited for the purpose of attracting such birds?

No.

Is it lawful to hunt with an automatic-loading or hand-operated repeating gun?

It is unlawful to hunt game birds, squirrels or rabbits with any automatic-loading or hand-operated repeating capable of holding more than three shells, the magazine of which has not been cut off or plugged with a one-piece metal or wooden filler incapable of removal without dismantling the gun. There cannot be more than three shells in the magazine and chamber combined.

Is it lawful to hunt game with a shotgun or other firearm equipped with a silencer?

No. It is unlawful for any person while hunting game in this State to have in his possession any kind of firearm equipped with any type of silencer.

What is the penalty for killing a doe deer?

Any person who kills, attempts

to kill, or has in his possession a doe (female) deer may be fined not less than one hundred dollars, or imprisoned for not less than ninety days, or both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court.

What is to be done with a deer accidentally killed on a highway?

The deer should be disposed of in a manner set forth in the statutes. It is suggested that the local protector or the Wildlife Resources Commission, in Raleigh, be contacted for specific instructions.

Is a minor required to have a hunting license?

A person who is under twenty-one years of age and is a dependent may hunt on his parents' land without a license if his parent is a resident of North Carolina.

A resident minor under sixteen years of age may hunt under the license of his parent or guardian, provided he carries the license with him or is accompanied by the parent or guardian who has the license in his possession.
