

# Sunday School Lesson

## Serve By Sharing

Jehoshaphat was the fourth king of Judah following its separation from Israel and reigned for 25 years. He is recorded as having pleased God as a leader of his people, being one of the few kings of Judah to be so commended.

Immediately after succeeding his father, Asa, as king, Jehoshaphat began to secure his nation against enemy attacks. He not only fortified cities near the borders of his country, but he also placed garrisons and military stores in strategic interior cities.

His preparation for defense so influenced neighboring nations that only once during his reign did either of them attempt to invade Jehoshaphat's land, and in this attempt, by Moab, there was great loss of life by the invaders.

Twice, however, Jehoshaphat joined the northern kingdom of Israel in war; once against Syria, which ended disastrously. It cost the life of Israel's king and Jehoshaphat narrowly escaped with his life. The other war of the united forces of the two countries ended in a limited victory against the Moabites.

Jehoshaphat extended the commerce of his country, and throughout his 25 years of leadership there was generally a high degree of prosperity among his people.

However, there were three special features of Jehoshaphat's

reign which contributed most to its being approved by Jehovah.

The record states that Jehoshaphat went out among the people from Beersheba to the hill country of Ephraim and brought them back to the God of their fathers.

During the reign of Rehoboam, first king of Judah, idolatry invaded the land and its evil influences corrupted a large number of the people. These heathen and corrupt influences had continued in varying degree until Jehoshaphat came to the throne. Altars to heathen gods had been established and worship of these gods prevailed, in many places.

Jehoshaphat discouraged the departure from the worship of Jehovah among his people, but he did not entirely eliminate idolatry and its terrible influence.

Another notable work of Jehoshaphat was his effort to have his people educated in the law of God as proclaimed by Moses and in the traditions of the Hebrew people. The king sent five high-ranking laymen, called princes, nine Levites and two priests through-

out the land with the "Book of the Law of the Lord" to instruct the people in all truths that would benefit them as good citizens and faithful followers of the Lord.

The third commendable action of King Jehoshaphat was the appointment of judges for the people. He was wise enough and democratic enough to want the honors and responsibility of governmental leadership divided between king and people.

In addition to selecting wise and able men to serve as judges for the people in various centers of the kingdom, Jehoshaphat also established a supreme court in the capital city of Jerusalem. Rather than to judge in civil and criminal cases and another court to serve in religious cases. Quite appropriately Jehoshaphat named the chief justice of the court to hear the religious cases. A layman of high authority, "the ruler of the house of Judah," was named as chief justice of the civil and criminal court. Here was a pattern worthy of being followed by rulers of all nations then and now.

The instructions Jehoshaphat gave to his judges is worthy of note. In defining the duties of the judges the king commanded, "Consider what you do, for you judge not for man but for the Lord; he is with you in giving judgment. Now then, let the fear of the Lord be upon you; take heed what you do, for there is no perversion of justice with the Lord our God, or partiality, or bribes."

What better instruction could be given, by anybody to any judge? (Lesson topic and Scripture selections by permission of the International Sunday School Lesson Committee.)
