Billy Guin has accepted a position as assistant purchasing agent at the McCain Sanatorium.

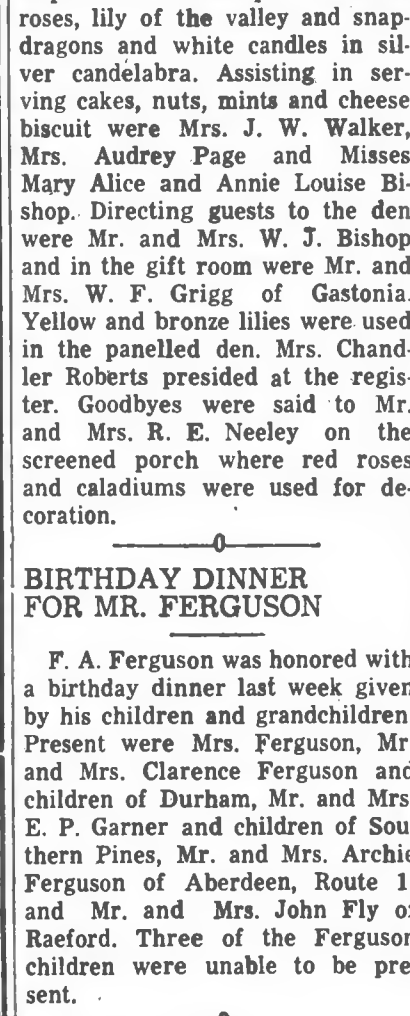
