In Colossians, Paul speaks about 15, characteristics of Christian relationships. Ten of these characteristics he strongly urges those who possess them to rid their minds, body and soul of their sin-

These are immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire and covetousness as one particular group. Following these are anger, wrath, malice, slander, and foul talk. Each of these are worthy of lessons within themselves, yet as we Christians attempt to understand them we need likewise to search hearts for traces of their effect.

The five virtues Paul calls to the attention of the Colossians should be allowed to replace the ten sins. They are compassion, kindness, lowliness, meekness and patience. We speak of these often. Seldom are they practiced as they are preached! Kindness is a sense of simple goodness that evenout

ple goodness that even out does that trait. Kindness is when we are willing to do by automatic action, a deed that becomes grateful without praise to another living soul. When a child has been trained to be kind to its elders then an ultimate type of kindness has been developed that makes for Christian Relationships between young and the old.

Lowliness is a sense of simple humility. When one is lowly he is unassuming, but sincere; unwanting in giory, but gracious in service. To be lowly in Christian relationships is to express with your actions, ways that point up an attempt to express the spi-

rit of Christ in your heart. Meekness is a being Christianly shy, but spiritually alive with the workings of Christ. Patience is the strength that comes when you are spiritually rich enough to overlook the faults of others -friends or foe - and instead of becoming irritable, help them to lose what irritable feeling toward life they possess.

As great as these deeds are, when we have possessed them, they are dangerously ebbing toward turning an about face within our own life. People have become so kind and so meek that they have lost their

sense of lowliness. People at times have become so Christian in action that they spiritually lose these five traits because they begin to condemn and judge another child of God. Instead of this they should both be attempting to reason feelings, expressed sincerely, to determine God's

way and God's will. -- We allow "the peace of Christ to rule within our hearts." When this happens then we safely do "everything in the name of Jesus Christ. **

These are easy words to pen or to say, but they are not easy deeds and tasks to do. It may mean that we become set aside from our particular habits that have marked us a life time if we allow " the peace of Christ to rule in our hearts." The reward for such action and witness is greater than the price.

Secondly, "if we do everything in the name of Christ Jesus, we automatically block many of the "righteous" things that were apart of our life. Again the reward is far greater than the price because we discover the rich blessings of Christ's way.

Relationships come within the home, the school, the factory, the office, play and the creeds and races of peoples. In all things we must seek God and His Guidance. Our decisions alone are no stronger than no decision at

Our decisions in the light of Christ's knowledge are decisions worthy of God!
