U. S. FORCES, GERMANY (AHTNC) -- Army Specialist Five Moody J. Cromartie, son of Mr. and Mrs. Moody J. Cromartie, Route 2, Lumber Bridge, participated in Winger Trial, a six-day Seventh Army medical field training exercise in Germany which ended March 3.

The exercise was designed to test evacuation and treatment procedures under simulated field combat conditions. Specialist Cromartie and other participating Seventh Army personnel help provide medical support for NATO forces in Europe.

The 28-year-old soldier, a medical specialist in the 12th Medical Company in Baumholder, entered the Army in September 1950 and was last stationed at Fort MacArthur, Calif.

He was graduated from Oak Ridge High School in 1959.

N.C. Ranks 11th In Ag Income

How does North Carolina agriculture stand, farm income-wise, in relation to the rest of the nation?

Fourth in cash receipts from crops; fourth in poultry; 19th in Livestock; 11th in total receipts.

These statistics were noted by Wayne Corpening of Winston-Salem, vice-president and agricultural manager of Wachovia Bank, at the recent tenth annual Farm Press, Radio and Television Institute at North Carolina State College.

"In the past ten years, the state's farm cash receipts have risen from \$816 million to \$1.2 billion a year," said Corpening. Livestock income doubled in the decade -- from \$160 million to \$320 million, he said.

"But we can't be satisfied with that," he added. "Our packing plants are operating at only 70 percent of capacity. There's potential for \$40 million more in business a year in meat processing, he said.

"If we produced all the meat we eat, we'd have about \$222 million more income a year to agriculture," he noted.

Corpening noted that 77 percent of all manufacturing and 82 percent of all payroll in the state are connected with some phase of agriculture.
