sional declaration of war and get it, or he will bring the war That would put him in an

enviable position. We would be engaged in an all-out fight as we were in 1944 when Franklin Roosevelt asked for a fourth term and got it. If the war were stopped before November, there would be no war issue for the against, and Johnson would have gained the credit for stopping

This much seems to be certain; If Lyndon Johnson wants the Democratic nomination, he will get it. In fact. if he goes to the convention, he will have the necessary votes in his hip pocket to swing the nomination

The major newspapers reported Sunday that party leaders in all 50 states favor Johnson by 65 per cent. Most of the rest of the convention sentiment and support is divided between Kennedy and McCarthy, with a 10 per cent segment not yet de-

Primary voters do not nominate the presidential candi-The nominations are conferred by political profes-sionals, and they already have confided that they are overwhelmingly for Johnson.

Nor are nominations or elections won by college students. They look good on television cheering Bobby Kennedy on, but most of them are too young to

If Johnson wins the nomination -- and we'll bet that he does -- he will very likely remain as president for four more years. That will depend, of course, on the Vietnam situation in November, plus domestic difficulties at home in civil rights, civil disorders, and the omic situation.

With those things in satisfactory condition, it would be entirely possible for Lyndon Johnson to retain the presidency by a landslide vote.

alternative employer possibilities under consideration. (Apparently there have been no major changes in these attitude patterns between 1961 and 1966, for an independent survey of a smaller sample of 1966 graduates showed about 58 per cent considering business.)

The CPC data were found to be consistent with a conclusion that a college graduate, interested in a certain profession, would be at least equally agreeable to pursuing it in business as ingovernment, university or research institute.

In examining value priorities, it was established that here,

too, the prime concern of graduates is in the type of work in which they will be engaged and that they are relatively indifferent as to whether this career is to be carried out in private business or elsewhere. In other words, the value judgments of the person who is a university chemist, for example, are no different from
