**Scholarship Deadline Nears**

Raleigh - Applications for the Prospective Teacher Scholarship Loan Fund, a program created by the 1957 General Assembly to encourage students to train as teachers, must be submitted no later than March 1, 1969. Students interested in teaching in the North Carolina public schools and who are in need of financial assistance for college training during the 1969-70 school year should write to: Scholarship Section, Division of Teacher Education, Department of Public Instruction, Raleigh 27602.

According to Morris C. Brown, supervisor of the Teacher Scholarship Loan Program, about 600 awards will be made in March and April. Each recipient will receive \$600 per year for up to four years of study. "Priority will be given to applicants who plan to teach in the elementary grades; however, other areas of study will be considered," he said.

A scholarship loan recipient may fulfill his obligation to the State by teaching in the public schools of North Carolina one year for each year of assistance received.
