 Astoria, Oregon - Bessie Lee McNeill, 18, daughter of Mrs. Estella McNeill, Route 2, Box 504 - A, Raeford has been graduated from the Tongue Point Women's Job Corps Center after completing a course in Health Occupations. She has been a trainee at the center here since March 1969. Tongue Point, which is operated by the University of Oregon under a contract with the Manpower Administration of the U. S. Department of Labor, with Philco - Ford Corp. presenting vocational training as sub-contractor, has a current enrollment of 730.

In addition to job - skill training, the Job Corps program included remedial education and personality development, and is available to disadvantaged young women between the ages of 16 and 21.
