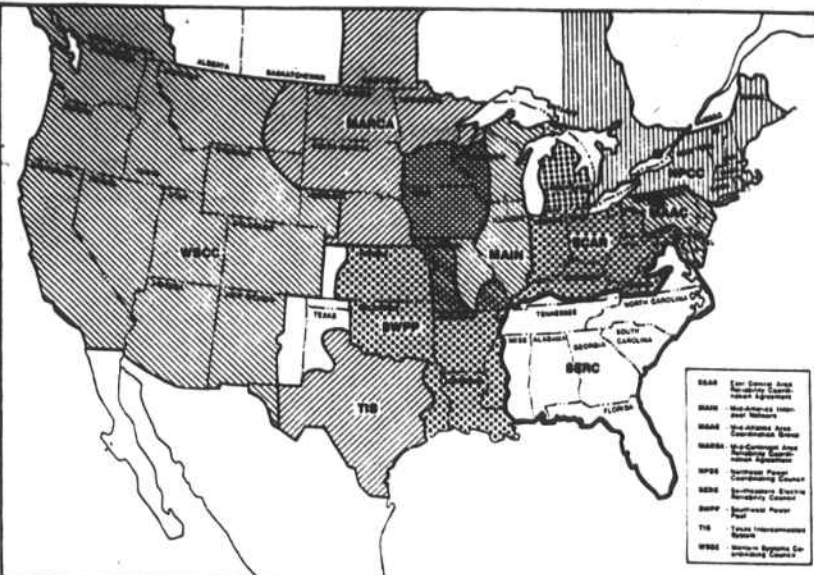

List Your Property Give In Your Poll

The Law Requires That You Do This During The Period From Jan. 2 thru Jan. 31, 1970

Notice is hereby given all persons owning Real or Personal Property that they appear before the taxlist for their township during the month of January and make return to him of all property for purposes of taxation. All male persons are required to give in their poll, if their ages are between 21 and 50. Failure to list in January will subject taxpayer to penalty. All property owned January 1, 1970 must be listed.

WHAT TO LIST:

REAL ESTATE . . .
 All taxable real property, including buildings and improvements and machinery permanently affixed to the Real Estate.

MOTOR VEHICLES . . .
 All automobiles and trucks in your possession or registered in your name. Mortgages do not change the ownership or affect the listing. Also house trailers, airplanes, scooters and motorcycles.

HOUSEHOLD, KITCHEN FURNITURE, FARM EQUIPMENT, FARM SUPPLIES
 Household furniture and goods, including electrical appliances and tools of trade. All farming equipment, swine, livestock, poultry, farm supplies and farm products produced prior to 1969.

STOCK, FIXTURES, EQUIPMENT . . .
 Merchandise, finished goods, equipment, furniture, fixtures goods in process, raw materials and samples.

OTHER PERSONAL PROPERTY . . .
 Radios, televisions, air conditioners, guns, bicycles, jewelry, diamonds, typewriters, boats and motors, golf equipment and office equipment.

U.S. and Norwegian Forces Practice Joint Maneuvers

LISTA, Norway (ANF) - U.S. Army units from the 8th Infantry Division and a unit of His Majesty King's Guards from Oslo, Norway, have completed a North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) exercise, NORDIC PASS, in southern Norway near Lista.

The purpose of the exercise was to practice and evaluate the command and staff procedures necessary to plan and coordinate a joint U.S.-Norwegian field training exercise.

NORDIC PASS involved a hypothetical response to a battalion-size task force threatening the security of a hypothetical, lightly defended air force base. The exercise plan called for the Norwegian government to request that NATO provide a reinforced airborne battalion to help defeat the aggressors.

In response to the call, U.S. forces were marshalled in Mainz, Germany, and flown over the battle area where they parachuted onto the air base. Here, the U.S. paratroopers linked with Norwegian ground forces and began defensive ground tactical operations. The final stage of the exercise was the redeployment of U.S. and Norwegian troops to their permanently assigned stations.

U.S. Army units from the 8th Infantry Division participating in the exercise were: Headquarters, 1st Airborne Brigade; 1st Battalion, 509th Airborne; A Battery, 5th Battalion, 81st Artillery; and A Troop, 3d Battalion, 8th Cavalry.
