## Recipes Give Appeal To Commodity Foods

Home extension agents and aides have been experimenting with new ways to make the commodity foods more appealing. Mrs. Ede Willis, Hoke, starts orange salad.

So far, a class that agent Mrs. Bruce, Albemarle, met with and Mrs. Grace Pierce and Mrs. Delores Darr last week to test new recipes using the surplus items now issued to low-income families.

Mrs. Pierce and Mrs. Darr will then demonstrate recipes to those in Hoke County.

So far they have made commodity sausage using the canned pork, chocolate sauce using commodity bean syrup, and egg custard using the dry-scrambled egg mix. Mrs. Willis said.

Their next project is a cake using rolled oats or rolled wheat with peanut butter using Oatmeal Cake.

**PEANUT BUTTERING.**  
1 cup sugar  
1 cup water  
1/2 cup peanut butter  
Mix sugar and water in boiler and bring to boil. Let boil one minute. Remove from heat and let cool. Add peanut butter and stir. Ice cake while it is still hot, making sure icing covers top of cake. Put cake back in hot oven and cook for 10 minutes at 350.
