

the local population, which refers to the surplus of births over deaths in the 10 - year period, is expected to be close

Incomes, also, have been on the rise since then. According the estimates made annually, the average income locally, after taxes, is in the neighborhood of \$1,640 per capita. It was \$870 in 1960.
