He was commended for his 30 years service with the company.

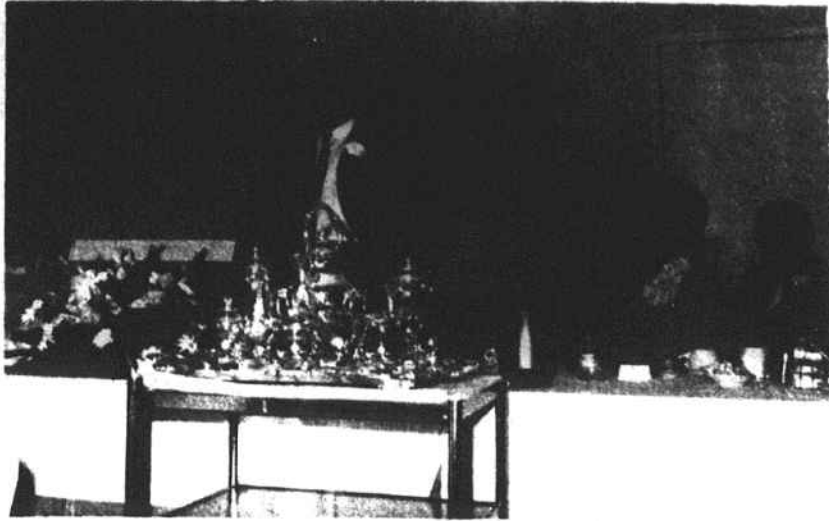
Cecil S. Dunn, secretary of the cooperative, was master of ceremonies.

Banking Company Income Increases

Southern National Corporation, one bank holding company for Southern National Bank of N.C., has reported increased earnings for the first quarter operations in 1970.

Consolidated net income rose 30% to \$433,836 or .56 per share compared to \$340,062 or .43 per share the first quarter of 1969 exclusive of security transactions. Total resources increased to \$168,680,930 compared to \$155,178,063 for 1969.

Net income growth for the past sixteen quarters has averaged 41% per annum despite costs of 22 new offices, the addition of Master Charge, and a new money management service, "Incomtrol."

Southern National Bank with 43 offices in North Carolina ranks 373 in the recent survey of the 1000 largest banks in the U.S., a jump of 18 places from its ranking last year of 391st.
