The national service officer of the Disabled American Veterans will speak at a special meeting of Hoke County Chapter No. 17 of the DAVs on April 17 at 7:30 p.m. at the Woodmen of the World Hall.

John L. Gates, of Winston-Salem, will discuss disability, with a question and answer period afterward.

All DAV members and wives and anyone with a service connected disability are urged to attend. Charlie Woodell, commander of the local chapter said.

Gates served in the Army from 1937 until he retired after 28 years of active service for reason of physical disability in 1962. He was then a Lieutenant Colonel. While in service, he was stationed in the Pacific during World War II and later served in Korea and Europe. He has been the

Mrs. Pope Will Attend Food Service Workshop

Mrs. Clara B. Pope, food service supervisor for Hoke

County Schools, will attend a school food service directors workshop in Asheville April 14-17.

About 100 directors from all parts of the state will meet for the program sponsored by the State Department of Public Instruction.

Ralph Eaton, director of school food services for the State Department of Public Instruction, is in charge of arrangements for the meeting. The program, he said, will emphasize administration, nutrition and management.

According to Eaton, the number of school food supervisors has increased from 40 in 1963 to 98 in 1970.

New Ostomy Club To Meet Friday

A special meeting of the newly formed Central Carolina Ostomy Club will be held in Raleigh, Friday, April 17, 1970.

Club President R.O. Heater of Cary, said surgeons and other health care representatives are expected to be present to discuss how they might be of assistance to ostomates.

Ostomates are people who have lost their colon, either through a colostomy or ileostomy because of cancer or other reasons.

Heater, who has been an ostomate himself for 25 years, estimates that there are hundreds of such persons in central North Carolina.

"We invite them to our meeting because of the technical assistance and moral support they can receive," Heater said.

The meeting is at 7:00 P.M. in the dining room of the new Mediacenter at 616 Wade Avenue, Raleigh, N.C.
