# Garden Time

This is a beautiful day in our neighborhood. Azure blue sky, bright sun, lazy breeze, and just enough zip in the air to make you want to pick up the fly rod and go popping. I just may do that, too, a little later on.

The spring days have been gorgeous. I don't believe I ever remember, or have enjoyed more, the profuse bloom and vivid colors of all blooming plants. Grass mowing has kept me busy, too, as we have had some real fine growing

Dahlias may be planted this month in all sections of the state. Be sure that you have a good bud on the stem end of the root. As long as the leaves are green, chlorophyll is being manufactured. This important process stores energy in the bulbs for next year's flowers.
