Club visitors were Mrs. Graham Pope and Mrs. Benny McLeod.

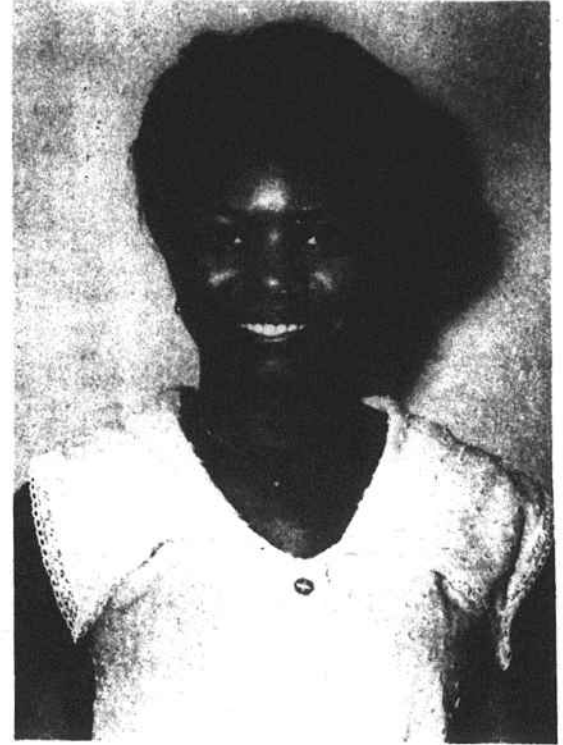
Mrs. Younger Snead Jr. won the club prize and Mrs. McLeod was winner of the visitor's award.

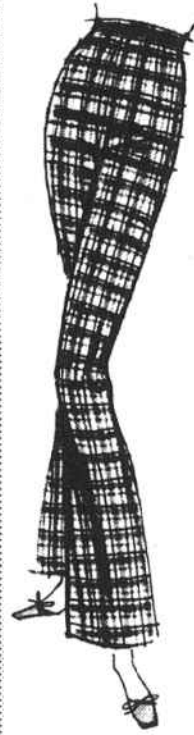

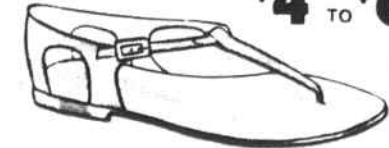
