"This man (Love) is accused of assaulting an 84-year-old man and if I had found that to be the case, I would have given him every day the law allowed. But because I wanted to make sure before sending a man off to prison. I have gone into the matter in some detail and on hearing the testimony, I am convinced that the cutting happened in the way defendant said it did - this is, accidentally, as a result of a

No one should ever come to court and plead guilty to a serious offense unless he is, in fact, guilty. And one one should never come to court for scrious offenese unrepresented.

It takes a fool to represent himself," Dupree said.

"After hearing the witnesses in this case, the court is of an opinion that the defendant is not guilty and orders the defendant's plea of guilty stricken and enters a plea of not guilty for the defendant. Love was found not guilty.
