In the church, palms formed a background of greenery for the three seven-branched candelabra entwined with Southern smilax and holding pink tapers and two floor baskets filled with pink and white gladioli, white mums and white daisies.

A program of nuptial music was presented by Mrs. Janice Benner Tew, organist, and Mrs. Ronald E. Hinson, sister of the bride, who sang, "Through The Years" and "O Perfect Love."

Saving Bonds Sales Increase

Sales of Series E and H United States Savings Bonds in North Carolina during July amounted to \$4,914,527, an increase of 11.2 percent over sales in July of last year.

Cumulative sales in North Carolina for January through July amounted to \$38,053,345, which is an increase of 3.7 percent over the same period a year ago. This represents 60.1 percent of the state's 1970 dollar goal of \$63,300,000.
