A special bond election will be held between 6:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M., Eastern Daylight Saving Time, Saturday, October 17, 1970, at which there will be submitted to the qualified voters of said City the following questions:

1. Shall an ordinance passed on August 24, 1970, authorizing the City of Raeford, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said City may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue Water Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$60,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any of the available funds, for extending the waterworks system of said City, including the construction and installation of deep wells and pumps and the acquisition of any necessary land, rights of way and equipment, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

2.
