The conference was sponsored by the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Columbia for directors and general managers of 19 Production Credit Associations throughout North Carolina.

Topics presented during the conference included Innovations in Credit Administration; Management

Audits; Planning for the Future and other current topics of interest.

Those appearing on the program were officers of the Credit Bank including R.A. Darr, president; J.C. Moore, senior vice president; J. Fred Taylor, Jr., vice president; and John L. Marshall, vice president and secretary. Other Bank staff members participating in the conference were: Merrelle W. Harris, state supervisor, and Tom D. Nolen, director, EFR. Dr. W.D. Toussaint, head, Department of Agricultural Economics, North Carolina State University, was the principal speaker.
