## TV Programs Planned For Tobacco Growers

The latest developments in tobacco production will be the topic of five special television programs planned for early January. The programs will be presented by six extension specialists over four commercial television stations and the University's educational television system. All phases of tobacco production will be covered. However, the emphasis will be on mechanization and the proper use of pesticides, according to Dr. William Collins, who is in charge of the extension tobacco program at North Carolina State University. Appearing with Collins on the programs are two other tobacco specialists, S.N. Hawks and Ben Kittrell. Other participants will include Furney Todd, a plant pathologist; R.L. Robertson, an entomologist; and Rupert Watkins, an agricultural engineer. The viewing schedule for the "tobacco workshops" is as follows:  
- Saturday, Jan. 9, from 7 to 9 a.m., Channel 9 (WNCT - TV) Greenville; and Channel 6 (WECT) Wilmington.  
- Saturday, Jan. 16, from 7 to 9 a.m., Channel 5 (WRAL - TV) Raleigh.  
- Saturday, Jan. 23, from 6:30 to 8 a.m., Channel 12 (WSJS - TV) Winston-Salem; and  
- Tuesday, Jan. 26, from 2:30 to 3:30 p.m., the university's educational television system.

## DA Suspends Enlistments For WO Flight Training

WASHINGTON (ANF) - Enlistments for the Warrant Officer Flight Training Program have been suspended, because a sufficient number of applicants has been obtained to meet the Army's aviator training requirement for fiscal year 1972. Individuals who have been enlisted in the 120-Day Delay Entry Program may be offered either another training option or discharge from the Delay Entry Program. Persons who do not desire other training or discharge will be brought onto active duty for aviator training. Commitments made by recruiters to individuals who are not currently enlisted in the Delay Entry Program will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis at a level not lower than recruiting district headquarters. Enlistments may be authorized only when exceptional circumstances would cause the applicant a hardship. It is expected that recruiting for this program will resume on or about July 1. However, the annual recruiting objective is expected to be substantially lower than during previous years.

## Aliens In Army May Obtain U.S. Citizenship Faster

WASHINGTON (ANF) - Many aliens in the Army are not aware of the liberalized naturalization procedures by which they can obtain U.S. citizenship sooner. Aliens should also be aware that U.S. military service may affect retention of citizenship in their native countries. Aliens on active duty should be provided this vital information in order to insure that they fully understand their rights. Details about mandatory counseling on the subject are in AR 608-3.

## Garden Time

The flowers of "Southern Belle" are formula mixed -- crimson, red, rose, pink, white and white with a red eye. It will bloom from seed the first year planted if the seeds are planted indoors and the small plants set in the open. The tops die down with hard freezes but will come up and bloom for many years. Snapdragon, "Little Darling", wins a bronze medal award. It is an open-faced F-1 hybrid color mixture that grows about 12 inches tall. It is similar to "Bright Butterflies", a previous but taller winner. This variety withstands windy locations quite well and is excellent for both cut flowers and landscape border planting. A hollyhock, "Silver Puffs", a bronze medal winner, is the first dwarf hollyhock. It grows only about 2 feet tall. The fluffy double flowers are a delicate silvery-pink. There is only one vegetable for 1971 -- "Early Xtra Sweet" sweet corn. It is reported to be truly extra sweet. The ears are 7 to 9 inches long and 1 1/2 to 2 inches in diameter. It has 12-16 rows of kernels per cob and grows to a height of 5 to 6 feet. "Early Xtra Sweet" is a bronze medal winner for 1971. If you read "Garden Time" last week you will remember that I discussed the modus operandi of the All-America Selection trials, and discussed two gold medal zinnia varieties for 1971, "Peter Pan Plum" and "Peter Pan Pink". We will continue with other winners in the flower trials for 1971. First an F-1 single Dianthus chinensis hybrid "Queen of Hearts" which received a silver award for 1971. It is the first F-1 hybrid dianthus and is noted for its vigor, uniformity and mass bloom characteristic throughout the summer and fall. The erect growth reaches a height of 12 to 15 inches and is 8 to 12 inches across. "Queen of Hearts" has brilliant scarlet red single flowers which are 1 - 1 1/2 inches wide and grouped in small clusters. The leaves give a dense cover to the base of the plant. This variety is classed as a hardy annual and may overwinter in mild climates. It blooms well from seed the first year planted. Hibiscus (moschoten) "Southern Belle" is also a silver medal winner for 1971.

## Veterans Corner

EDITOR'S NOTE: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.  
Q - I attend school under the G.I. Bill, and my wife has given birth to a son. How do I notify VA of this additional dependent?  
A - Forward immediately to your VA regional office a copy of the child's birth certificate. Write your VA file number on the document and attach a note stating that you are training under the G.I. Bill.  
Q - I am a reservist and have been on active duty for the past six months. Will my Servicemen's Group Life Insurance protect me during the 120 - day period immediately following separation from six - months' military obligation?  
A - Yes.  
Q - When did the current G.I. educational bill take effect?  
A - While the present G.I. Bill became law in June 1966, it covers veterans who served after January 31, 1955.  
Q - I am a 19 - year - old college student who draws a death pension from Va. When I marry will my pension be discontinued?  
A - Yes. Pension is not paid to a child after marriage.  
Q - A service - connected injury left me permanently and totally disabled. Will my children receive VA educational assistance while in high school?  
A - No. Under this program, the law prohibits payment for a regular high school education, unless the child has a mental or physical disability.

## The Law Requires That You Do This During The Period From Jan. 4 thru Feb. 6, 1971

Listing begins Monday, Jan. 4, 1971 (Due to Holidays)  
Notice is hereby given all persons owning Real or Personal Property that they appear before the taxlister for their township between Jan. 4 and Feb. 6, and make return to him of all property for purposes of taxation. All male persons are required to give in their poll, if their ages are between 21 and 50. Failure to list will subject taxpayer to penalty. All property owned January 1, 1971 must be listed.

- ### WHAT TO LIST:
- REAL ESTATE... All taxable real property, including buildings and improvements and machinery permanently affixed to the Real Estate.
  - MOTOR VEHICLES... All automobiles and trucks in your possession or registered in your name. Mortgages do not change the ownership or affect the listing. Also house trailers, airplanes, scooters and motorcycles.
  - HOUSEHOLD, KITCHEN FURNITURE, FARM EQUIPMENT, FARM SUPPLIES Household furniture and goods, including electrical appliances and tools of trade. All farming equipment, swine, livestock, poultry, farm supplies and farm products produced prior to 1970.
  - OTHER PERSONAL PROPERTY... Radios, televisions, air conditioners, guns, bicycles, jewelry, diamonds, typewriters, boats and motors, golf equipment and office equipment.
  - STOCK, FIXTURES, EQUIPMENT... Merchandise, finished goods, equipment, furniture, fixtures goods in process, raw materials and samples.
