Farm Items

The possibility of conducting a one or two week Cotton Classing Short Course at Morehead City, N.C. in late June for producers, ginners, shippers and mill employees is being considered. The course would cover instructions and practice in cotton grading, stapling and machine testing using micronaire and Pressley equipment. It will take a minimum of 15 students to make the course possible. Tuition for the two weeks course will be from \$25.00 - \$30.00. Persons interested in enrolling should contact the county agent's office before April 15, 1971.

Cotton growers should

consider several things this coming year. (1) There may be a problem of a short supply. This could escalate prices too on high and could cause a shortage of certain grades and staples. The results could be that synthetics will gain ground. (2) D.D.T. will probably be used this year but hearings will be held shortly on the subject. (3) A grower can produce up to 10% more acreage, over and above allotment. (4) Herbicides should be incorporated 2-3 weeks before planting for better stand maintenance and early weed control. (5) Planting on beds provides early germination of seed and more vigorous seedling development.






