He was honored at Laredo AFB, Tex., where he now serves with a unit of the Air Training Command.

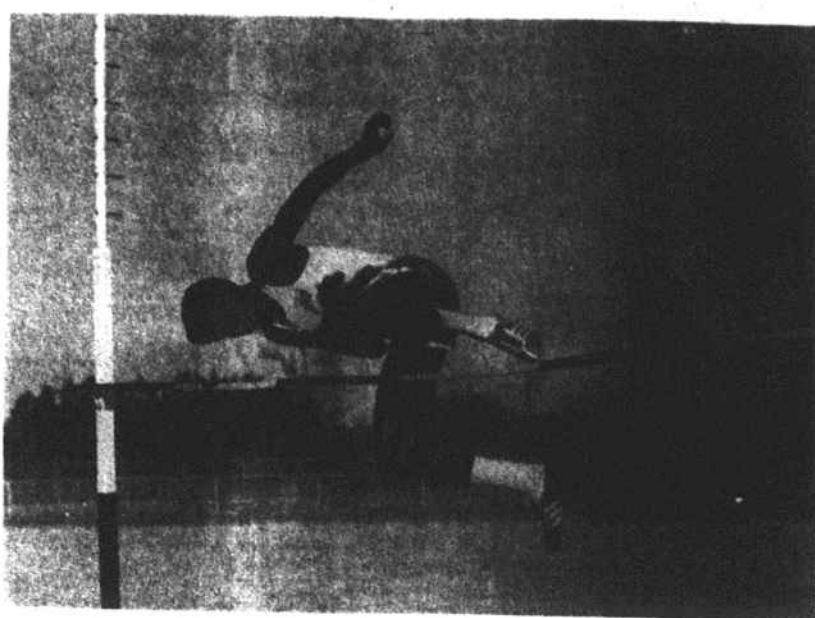
The sergeant is a 1968 graduate of Hawk Eye High School.
