High school will come to a close Monday night for 249 seniors as they receive diplomas from Hoke County High School principal Raz Autry in graduation ceremonies at the stadium.

The baccalaureate service will be held Sunday night at 8 p.m. in the stadium with the Rev. Milton H. Williams as speaker.

The Rev. Mr. Williams is pastor of McLaughlin Chapel A.M.E. Zion Church in Raeford. A native of Cumberland County, he graduated from Oak Ridge High School in Lumber Bridge. He is a student at Fayetteville State University, majoring in education.

He has held pastorates in West End and Jackson Springs A.M.E. Zion churches and has been the pastor of the McLaughlin Chapel A.M.E. Zion Church since 1965.

The graduation exercises will begin at 8 p.m.



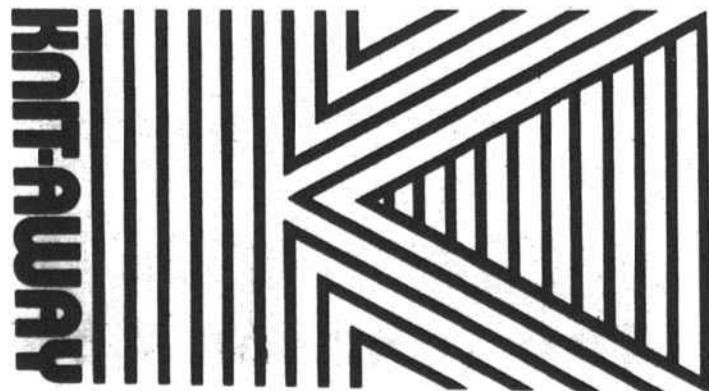
