Jaycees Go To Convention

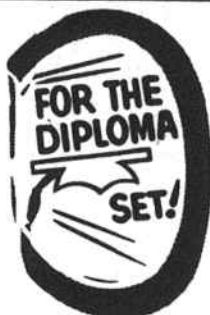
