What can Social Security do to assist students who are in need of funds to continue their education? As most people know, Social Security can make payments to children up to age 18, but what happens after the child reaches age 18? Social Security can now continue payments past age 18 if the child qualifies as a student. Two basic considerations must be met to satisfy this requirement:

1. The student must attend school full time.
2. The schooling must be in a recognized educational institution.

Of course, we cannot make payments if the student is married. Also, if the student is employed and has earnings in excess of \$1680 for the year, the number of checks received in the year is affected.

At this point, any student reading this column may say, "Well, where do I go to sign up for my checks?" It is not all this easy! For student benefits to apply there must be entitlement to a Social Security account. This means that one of the student's parents must be eligible to receive benefits from Social Security based upon that parent's retirement, disability or death.

Any student or any parent with a student who will be resuming his education this Fall, should contact our Social Security office for full details regarding Social Security benefits for students. The student should bring with him his birth certificate and his Social Security card. In Fayetteville, we can be contacted in Room 142, Federal Building, 301 Green Street, or telephone 483-2661.

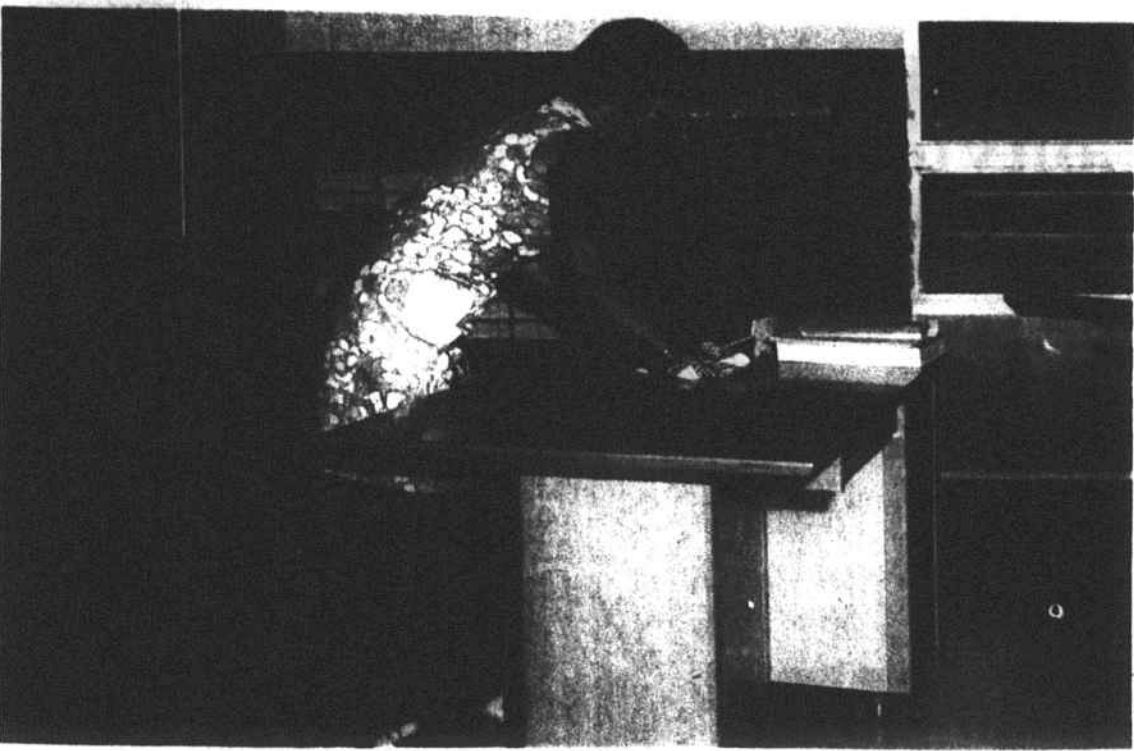

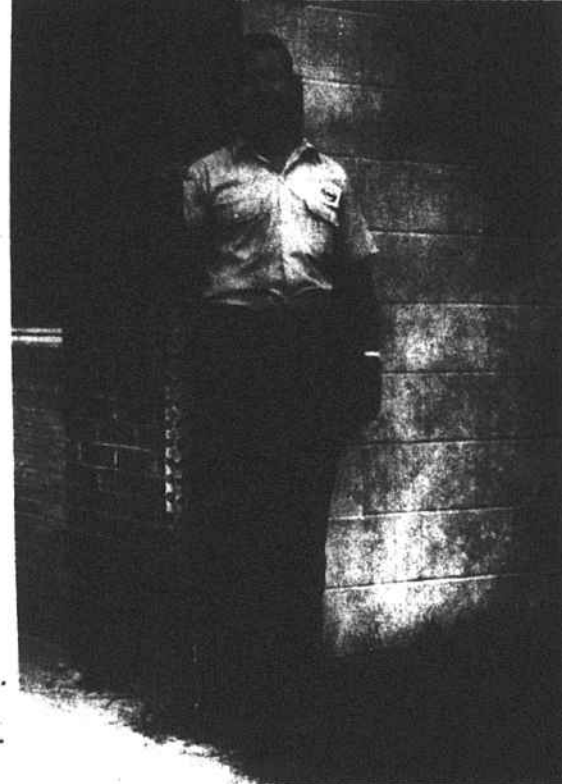

Camp Easter serves the disabled in the state as part of the recreational services provided by the Easter Seal Society. The Camp is operated by funds donated through the Easter Seal appeals and special gifts from interested groups and individuals throughout North Carolina. The Camp is located in Southern Pines and is operated for ten weeks during the summer. Camp sessions are open to campers from 6 to 60 years of age with two - week sessions for each age group. According to Doctor Mahaffee, "The state is becoming aware of handicapped individuals by helping them to become involved. Camp Easter is open to any disabled person who can benefit from a camping experience.

required clearance from 47 different agencies.

"It takes longer to plan a road than it does to build it," Dawkins told the commissioners. He repeated his statement made last summer when the project was approved, that he planned to have the four - laning contract let by the end of the Scott administration.

Hoke County leads the rest of the state in the number of secondary paved roads, Dawkins said. There are only 37 unpaved roads in the county, he said, and the closest competitor has 79 unpaved roads.

He gave a map to the commissioners showing that during his time as highway commissioner there have been 16 roads graded, based and paved and seven roads graded and based. Work was not able to be done as scheduled on seven roads because the right - of - way was refused. "I think you will find that on secondary roads more has been done in the county in these two years than at any time since the Kerr Scott administration," Dawkins said.

The highway commission is presently studying a proposed connector road between N.C. 211 East and U.S. 401, he announced. They are also surveying an area on College Drive bothered with a drainage problem to determine the liability of the highway commission.

At the request of the commissioners, Dawkins ordered a study made at Virgil's Drive-in to see if it could be made safer there.
