### County Starts Early Program

The county will operate two pre-school programs similar to Head Start this year at West Hoke and Scurlock schools. The students were chosen from applicants to the three Head Start classes. The county's program was begun this week and the Head Start program will begin Sept. 9. The county program is funded under Title I money from the federal government and the Head Start classes are funded by the Office of Economic Opportunity. This is the first year the county has had a pre-school program and it is also the first year the Head Start program has operated during the full school year. There was no summer Head Start program here this year.
