Doran Berry Is Speaker For Woman's Club

Doran Berry, candidate for the seventh district congressional seat was the speaker Tuesday night at the open meeting of the Raeford Woman's Club. The meeting was held at 8 o'clock p.m. at the Raeford Civic Center. The Home Life Department served as hostesses and were in charge of the program.

Mrs. Alfred K. Leach, Hoke County's first woman candidate for the School Board, was recognized. During the business meeting, presided over by Mrs. Hubert Cameron, president, plans were finalized for the Horse Show to be presented March 25.

Mr. Berry was introduced by Mrs. Clayton Buoyner. He gave a brief history of the Friendship Foundation which was organized in 1968 to help combat drug abuse in Fayetteville and Cumberland County. The Foundation now maintains a Friendship House, which combines a crisis center for drug addicts and a Halfway House for former addicts who need a place to stay following hospitalization or prison. The Friendship Foundation also sponsors a farm in Cumberland County used as therapeutic community for former addicts.

Berry said that law enforcement alone was not enough but that by giving of our time, financial resources, and love we could help prevent drug abuse in our community.

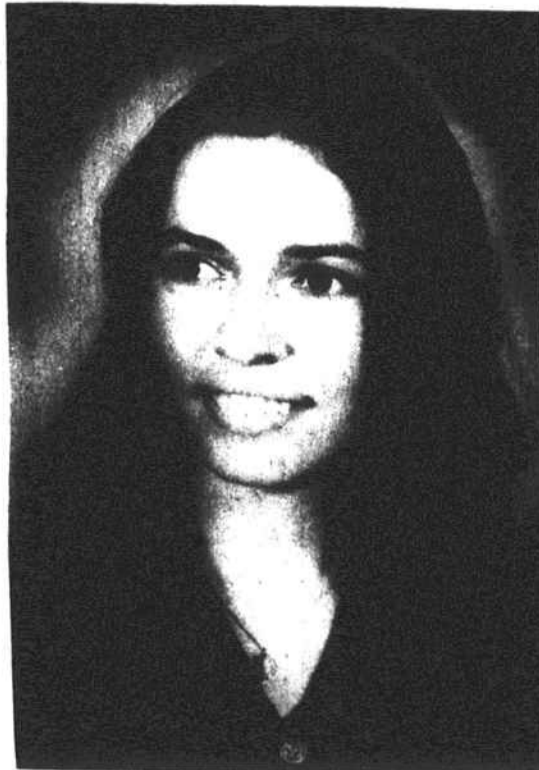
