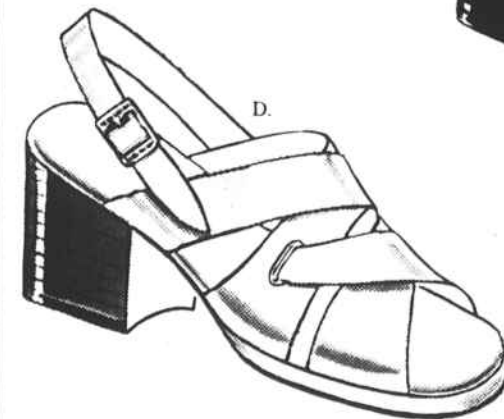
B. JOSEPH... The many colored casual with a comfortable low heel. Smooth leather uppers in beige, tan, nude and dark brown combination.



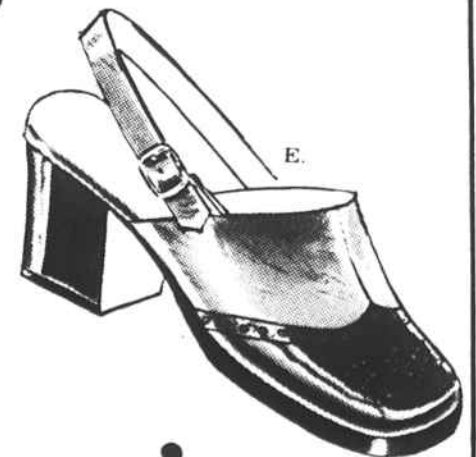
C. SIDE CAR... A smooth leather, good looking sandal in blue with charming side lacing detail. Stacked heel and sole.
