CHARLOTTE, N.C. - J. Kenneth Clark, vice president and director of corporate communications for NCNB Corporation, has been elected national treasurer of the Public Relations Society of America (PRSA) for 1975.

Wildlife Afield

Let's take a quick quiz to see how much you know about the wildlife conservation program in North Carolina. Here's a hint. If you get all these questions right without guessing, you're unusually well informed because some of these are difficult.

1) TRUE.....or FALSE.....The daily bag limit on doves is set each year by the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission following a study of the dove population by wildlife biologists.

2) TRUE.....or FALSE.....If you catch someone hunting on your private, posted property, the best thing to do is call your local Wildlife Protector.

3) TRUE.....or FALSE.....If you pay taxes in North Carolina, you are automatically contributing to state-supported wildlife programs to conserve fish and game populations and improve hunting and fishing.

4) TRUE.....or FALSE.....The deer population in North Carolina is undergoing a slow but steady decline as a result of changing habitat, poaching and hunting.

5) TRUE.....or FALSE.....If you like to hunt and fish, a career as a Wildlife Protector (game warden) is a good way to combine business and pleasure.

6) TRUE.....or FALSE.....A law-abiding sportsman who follows all state and federal laws governing hunting and fishing should never have to worry about violating any law pertaining to these sports.

Okay, all finished? Here are the answers.

1) This one is FALSE. The daily bag limit on doves is set by Federal authorities under the U.S. Bureau of Fish and Wildlife. All migratory birds, including waterfowl, are regulated by Federal authority, though states may select certain options on some species.

2) Again, FALSE. Though a Wildlife Protector may be able to assist you by verifying that someone is indeed hunting on your property, he cannot make an arrest for trespassing. The Wildlife Commission has no authority over trespass laws, so if someone is hunting on your property without permission, your best bet would be to call the Sheriff.

3) FALSE. No state taxes are channeled to support wildlife conservation programs in North Carolina. Such programs are paid for primarily by license fees from hunters and fishermen.

4) FALSE. The deer population is actually increasing in North Carolina, and is in fact higher now than at any time in recorded history largely as a result of wildlife management programs supported by hunting license sales.

5) FALSE. I'll bet this one fooled you. Ask any Wildlife Protector and he'll quickly tell you that he's so busy enforcing wildlife laws during prime hunting and fishing times that he rarely ever has a chance to go hunting and fishing.

6) FALSE. Perhaps this wasn't a fair question, but although a knowledge and willingness to abide by all state and federal laws governing hunting and fishing is very commendable, it isn't enough to keep you out of possible trouble. Some communities and counties in North Carolina have passed local laws pertaining to hunting and fishing which may affect only a small area, but the sportsman is responsible for knowing about them too.

That's it. How did you do? If you got them all correct, take a bow. You know more about wildlife conservation programs and laws in this state than 90 percent of the rest of us.

spell out very clearly the confidentiality of the income tax records of the people of our state."

This was an apparent reference to the controversy surrounding Rufus L. Edmisten, Democratic candidate for attorney general, who admitted not paying North Carolina income tax while claiming residency in the state. He worked for several years as a Senate aide and lived in Virginia. The question arose when an aide to Edmisten's opponent, James H. Carson, Jr., asked Edmisten if he had paid state income taxes.

Edmisten, who was elected last week, has maintained that information on his taxes was leaked by the Republican-controlled state revenue department.

Hunt added that with the GOP controlling the executive branch and Democrats heading the legislative branch, "in the interest of good government" partisan politics must be laid aside.

water conveys, as a general rule, both the land above the water and the bed of the stream to its middle thread.

The State of North Carolina owns all lands beneath navigable waters within the boundaries of this State.

A 1959 North Carolina statute defines navigable waters as "all waters which are navigable in fact."

Watercourses are navigable in fact, according to the North Carolina Supreme Court, if in their ordinary state they have capacity and suitability for the usual purpose of navigation by vessels or boats such as are employed in the ordinary course of commerce, trade, and travel. The capacity of the water for such use rather than actual use is sufficient.

Although a riparian owner does not own the bottom of a navigable watercourse, he does own the bank or banks and is entitled to certain rights by virtue of this fact. He may, for example, construct wharves or piers, subject to such regulations as may be imposed by legislation.
