

Efficient Fertilization of Tobacco is a bulletin that every farmer should have a copy of in 1975. Costs of fertilizer will be up this year and this bulletin can help you work out the proper nutrients. It also gives information about yields from research that has been done on different types of fertilizer application. It also gives information on leaching and how to correct the amounts lost.

tobacco another bulletin that can be useful. Last year one of the biggest problems in tobacco production, was poor plant beds. This year we must work on this and have strong plants.
