"The Law merit badge is broad in scope so that it will give a Scout an opportunity to explore law as a career and to be familiar with the knowledge about law that affects his daily life.

The merit badge requirements cover history, civil and criminal law, law enforcement, contracts, courts, and types of jobs which deal with some aspects of law or legal processes. The requirements also call for a Scout to "tell where a person can go if he needs the help of a lawyer but is unable to pay for one" and "what he can do if he can afford a lawyer but does not know of
