LISTING BEGINS THURSDAY, JAN. 2, 1975 (Due To Holidays)

Notice is hereby given all persons owning Real or Personal Property that they appear before the taxlisters for their township between Jan. 2 and Jan. 31 and make return to them of all property for purposes of taxation. Failure to list will subject taxpayer to a fine of \$500.00 or imprisonment not to exceed six months. All property owned January 1, 1975 must be listed

All Mobile Home Park and Aircraft Storage Facility Operators must furnish to the Tax Supervisor the name of the owner of each mobile home or airplane and a description of each by January 15, 1975.

REAL ESTATE.

All taxable real property, including buildings and improvements and machinery permanently affixed to the Real Estate.

HOUSEHOLD, KITCHEN FURNITURE, FARM Household furniture and goods, including electrical appliances and tools of trade. All farming equipment, swine, livestock, poultry, farm supplies and farm products produced prior to 1974.

OTHER PERSONAL PROPERTY

Radios, televisions, air conditioners, guns, bicycles, jewelry, diamonds, typewriters, boats and motors, golf equipment and office equipment.

Bucks Topple Dunn, Pinecrest

The Bucks stretched their string of wins to 15 as they comped past Pineciest 91-77 Tuesday night. They had tucked Dunn under their belt Friday night, downing them 63-57, Hoke High now leads the conference

with a 4-0 record. They will meet Clinton there Friday night. In Tuesday's game, Allen Thomas and

Ronald Black turned in big games, adding 26 points apiece for the Bucks. George Maynor turned in 22 points, the only other Buck to be in the double figures.

Others scoring for Hoke were James Rainey, 9: Alphonso Haynes and Larry Black, four each.

Hoke grabbed an early lead and improved upon it. The Bucks went into the halftime break with a comfortable 46-27 margin.

Hoke players snatched a total of 102 rebounds for the night with Bainey grabbing 34 to lead his team. Thomas followed close behind with 30, while Maynor got 14 and Black and Haynes took 12 each.

The unbeaten Bucks narrowly defeated Dunn Friday night in a hard fought battle for a beith in the 3-A Southeastern Conference. The final

score was 03-57 It was the 14th straight victory Bucks' star George Maynor, plagued

by low scoring in recent games, came out the slump to score 20 points. Allen Thomas picked up 18. Maynor is credited with saving the

night by a driving layup and 25 foot jump shot, which boosted the Hoke lead to 61-56 with only forty-one seconds The Bucks were behind by as many as

nine points in the first half, as the Greenwaves didn't let up on a surge led by Fred Chavis.

Trailing at the Irall', the Bucks came into the third quarter and renewed their efforts against Dunn with some vigorous work at the boards. The quarter ended in a 4545 tie.

In a 4545 tie, Hoke grabbed a slim lead with a baseline jumper from Maynor with 5:46 remaining in the last quarter. The contest was far from decided and the score stood at 53-51. The Greenwaves hung on stubbornly and with only 2:11 to play they trailed by only one point.

Maynor's spectacular play with 41 seconds left, assured Hoke the victory with 61-56 showing on the scoreboard


