Regulations Announced

To See School Records

Education recognizes the right of any parent to review the cumulative record of his or her child. The following regulations shall be adhered to in this 1. Prior to the review of a cumulative

record the parent must submit in writing a request to the appropriate principal to see their child's record.

2. The parent shall be notified by

mail that their child's record is available.

3. The record shall be reviewed at the school in which the child is currently enrolled. The review shall be in the presence of the principal or his designee.

4. Form EC-9 shall be signed by the

parent at this time. 5. If the parent wishes for the record to be released to another school, agency or individual, form EC-12 shall be completed, notarized and submitted to the principal.
