Four Named Outstanding Teachers At Hoke High

Four Hoke High teachers have been nominated as outstanding secondary educators by Principal Allen Edwards and will be included in the "Outstanding Secondary Educators in North Carolina" yearbook.

Those nominated are Miss Emma Jean Mims, Robert H. Gatlin, Margaret H. Peden, and Mrs. Neill A. McNeill.

This is the first year Hoke High has participated in the national program recognizing instructors in secondary schools, publicity chairman Marilyn Semones said.

Selection is made on the basis of years of service, outstanding reputation in the classroom, participation in extracurricular activities, community contributions, and high regard for students, she said.

Miss Mims, a native of Raleigh, is a graduate of Shaw University with a B.S. in Science. She taught at Upchurch School before coming to Hoke High, where she is now assistant principal. She is a member of the National Science Teachers' Association, NEA, NCAE, and the Classroom Teachers' Association.

Mr. Gatlin is a native of Raeford and received his B.S. in Civil Engineering

from N.C. State University in 1931. He taught at Duke University before coming to Hoke High, where he taught occupational education until his retirement last month. He served on the Board of Education for nineteen years.

Mrs. Peden, a native of Hamlet, has been teaching for 32 years. She graduated from Flora Macdonald College in 1943 and began her career in Scotland County schools. She has been an instructor of homemaking and consumer education at Hoke High for 26 years. She is a member of numerous professional organizations and has served on state committees.

Mrs. McNeill was graduated cum laude from Flora Macdonald College with a double major in voice and music. She came to Raeford as a music education teacher and currently teaches Music Theory, Music Appreciation, and Chorus and Chorale. Mrs. McNeill was chosen "Teacher of the Year" by the Raeford Woman's Club in 1961. She is an active member of many music education professional organizations.

The four will vie for the title of district winner, to be announced in the spring. A \$500 cash prize will be awarded.

Optional School At Hoke High

An optional extended day school is being operated by Hoke High for students who are not attending regular school, Mrs. Betty Rogers of Hoke High announced.

The program enables students to earn credit toward a diploma, prepare to return to regular school, attend vocational classes, and receive job placement assistance.

To be eligible for the program, prospective students must be between 16 and 18 years old, not presently in school, able to attend school while working full or part-time, and be recommended by Principal Edwards or program advisor Leslie Frahm.

Interested persons who qualify should contact either Mr. Frahm at the Board of Education offices or Miss Emma Simms at Hoke High.

The optional school program is designed to fit the needs of those who are unable to attend regular classes for a variety of reasons, Mrs. Rogers said.
