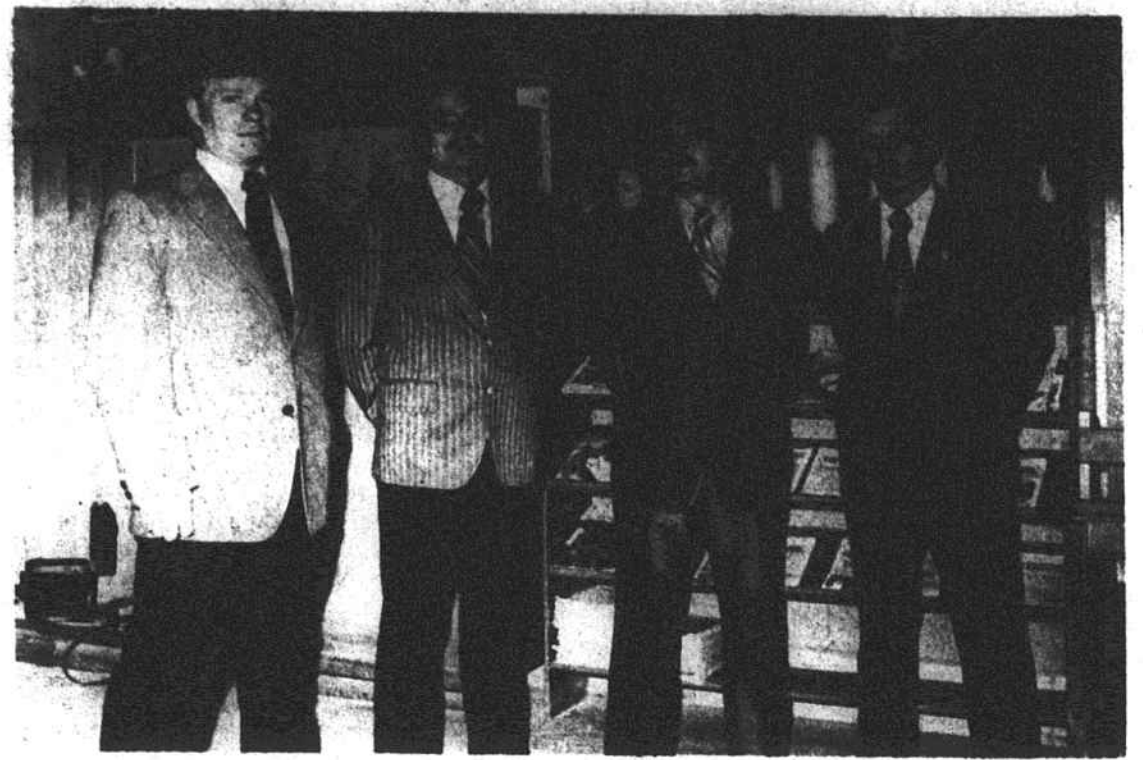

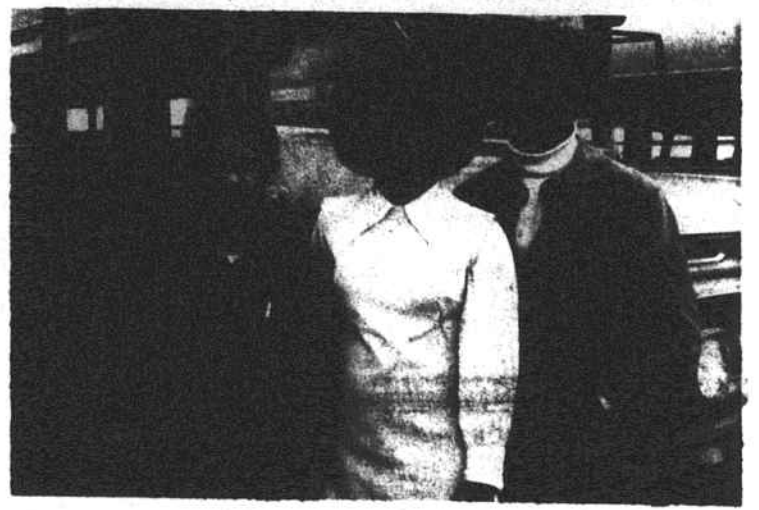
He came to this country to visit textile schools since SENAI plans to restructure and update its technical senior high schools, starting with the School of Textiles.
