past my destination. Sometimes I make doubly sure by getting off at the street ahead.

A lot of things are different lately. Barbers no longer hold up a mirror behind me when they've finished so I can see the back of my head. They don't put the same material into clothes anymore either. I've noticed that all my suits have a tendency to shrink, especially in certain places, such as around the waist, or in the seat of the pants, and the laces they put in shoes nowadays are much harder to reach. Then, too, construction is different.

Clocks have become entirely unreliable. They run slow for awhile and then they run fast. Formerly I would look at the clock before hitting the hay and it would register about twelve o'clock. Now, after waking from a short nap in my easy chair and deciding that it's bedtime, I look at the clock and it says nine o'clock. It is perplexing that they run so slow in the evening when they run so fast in the morning. Eight o'clock now comes at 6:00 a.m. (Of course this is really a help for I love to hear the birds sing and I want to be sure the milkman has arrived so I can have cream for my breakfast coffee.)

Even the weather is changing. It is getting colder in winter and the summers are hotter than they used to be. (I'd go away if it wasn't so far.) Snow is heavier when I try to shovel it, and I have to put on rubbers whenever I go out, because the rain we get today is wetter than the rain we used to get. Drafts are more severe too. It must be the way they build windows now.

People are changing too. For one thing they're younger than they used to be when I was their age. I went back recently to an alumni reunion af the college where I graduated, and I was shocked to see the mere tots they're admitting as students these days. The average freshman class couldn't have seem more than seven years old. They seem more polite than in my time though - several undergraduates called me "Sir" and one of them asked me if he could help me across the street. On the other hand, people my own age are so much older than I am.

(I realize that my generation is approaching middle age. (I define this age roughly as the period between 21 and 110) but there is no excuse for my classmates tottering into a state of

advanced senility.) I got to thinking these things over while I was shaving this morning. I stopped and looked at my own reflection in the mirror. They don't seem to be making good mirrors

According to city manager John Gaddy, the payment is based on a change in the federal cost sharing rate. When the \$1,106,621 project was begun in March, 1969, the federal government was funding 33 per cent of such projects. A total of \$332,649 in federal funds was spent on the expansion.

Later, the federal participation rate was upped to 50 per cent and the city applied for reimbursement for the ference.

Raeford officials made application for \$276,000 but Gaddy said that it was doubtful that the city would receive any more money from EPA. A total of \$1,900 million was allocated for reimbursements to local governments and already \$2,765 million in applications have been received.

The money will be credited to the water and sewer fund.
