

The undefeated girls' track team captured the NCHSAA women's eastern sectional track and field championship meet at New Bern Friday, by a wide margin.

Star athlete Kathy McMillan broke the sectional records in two events.

The 17-year-old junior recorded a 20' 3½" leap in the long jump, and also set a record in the 220-yard dash with a time of 25.1.

The Hoke girls collected 36 points in the meet, far ahead of second place Lejeune with 22. Nineteen other teams finished with scores out of about forty
